Markets, Crops and Prospects.

There has been a rise in the price of oats to 36 cents per bushel. But eggs hold at 9 cents per dozen, and potatoes have gone to nothing. The very great advantage derived from last year's excellent crop of wheat has been well discounted by the fall in potatoes. There will, too, be a heavy loss on lobsters, unless prices improve. It is estimated that the pick of this year will not reach one-third that of last year, notwithstanding the larger number of persons who rashly engaged in the business. Continued high winds have brought confusion upon the fishermen. A number of lobster factories in all parts of the Province have been shut down. Crops look particularly well wherever the land is in good till. Unfortunately the value of too many acres has been reduced by reckless cropping with oats. But, on the whole, the prospects for another extra good crop are, at the present writing, excellent. A heavy crop of hay is assured.

Address. The following is a copy of the address presented to Rev. A. P. McLellan, Rector of St. Dunstan's College, by Mr. D. Morrison, on behalf of the professors and students:—

Address. REV. But while we are moved to sadness at this inevitable separation, we extend our warmest congratulations to those who in future will acknowledge your spiritual guidance. In you they will find a true and devoted priest, a willing assistant in every good work and a stern opponent of vice in all its forms; in you they will find a true type of that exemplary pastor whose whole being is bound up in the welfare of his flock.

As for ourselves, though we shall no longer have a knowledge your loving jurisdiction, we shall always bear in our hearts sentiments of the most lively gratitude for all the favors you have wrought in our behalf, and in our pilgrimage the salutary lessons which we have received from you will be as guiding stars leading us safely through the dangers and temptations of life's weary way. Please accept the accompanying present as a slight memento, and being assured of our most earnest prayers for your future perseverance we humbly ask you in the fullness of your charity to remember us in your daily remembrances before the throne of the great High Priest of all.

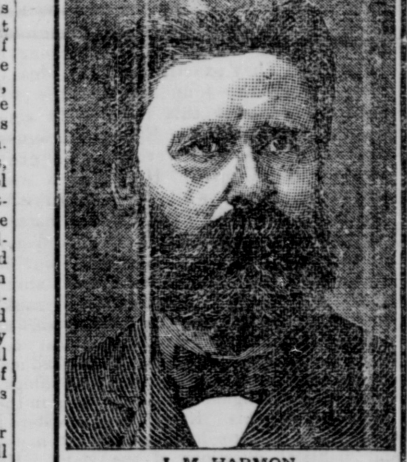
MADRID, June 23.—Violent storms sweep over the province of Burgos, in old Castile yesterday. A number of villages were destroyed.

World's Columbian Exposition, Chicago, 1893.

THE Government of the Dominion of Canada has accepted the invitation of the Government of the United States to take part in the World's Columbian Exposition, to be held in Chicago from 1st May to 31st October, 1893. As it is important that a very full display of Canadian products be made on that occasion, a general invitation is extended to Canadian producers and manufacturers in agriculture, horticulture, manufactures, etc., to assist in bringing together such a display of the natural resources and industrial products of Canada as will be a credit to the country.

An Executive Commissioner for Canada has been appointed, who will have the general charge of the exhibits and the allotment of space, and who will see that the Canadian exhibits are in every way well adapted to the view of making the exhibition as complete and satisfactory as possible.

The Dominion Government will pay the transport of exhibits going and returning, and for the placing of articles on the exhibits. The receipt of articles at the Exhibition building will be on or before 1st November, 1892, and all exhibits, excepting live stock, must be in place by 1st April, 1893.
