

# Diabetic Ass'n Has Address On How Emotions Affected

The general meeting of the Charlottetown and District Branch of Canadian Diabetic Association was held recently in the National Film Board Theatre, with the president, Sister Joan Mary providing. Approximately 22 persons were in attendance, including diabetics, relatives and friends.

Mr. C. Praught, district director for Canadian Diabetic Association, told the group that Dr. Burke Howard, Charlottetown, had been nominated for membership of the National Medical Advisory Board of the Canadian Diabetic Association. Mr. Praught also informed the group that other doctors with a special interest in diabetics might apply for membership.

The highlight of the meeting was the presentation of the Dr. Peasby "Award of Merit" for the branch making the greatest contribution to the work of diabetics in Canada during 1962. The presentation was made by Mr. Praught, administrator of the Diabetic control program to Sister Joan Mary, president of the branch.

Following the presentation, Dr. Margaret Burke, guest speaker for the meeting, gave a most interesting and informative talk on the great part which the emotions play on the diabetic. Dr. Burke traced very clearly the history of diabetes, the discovery of insulin and its

Another two volumes of French folk songs now are being prepared by Dr. Barbeau, said Dr. L. S. Russell, director of the museum.

Dr. Russell said Dr. Barbeau is also compiling a dictionary of the Huron-Wyandotte language.

# French-Canadian Folk Songs Are Described In New Book

OTTAWA (CP) — Dr. Marius Barbeau has duplicated once again his voluminous collection of Canadian folklore and produced a new book on folk songs of love and adventure sung in early French Canada.

The volume, entitled Le Rossignol Y Chante, is one of about 60 published by the 78-year-old retired federal government anthropologist since he began studying Canadian folklore 46 years ago.

Dr. Barbeau retired from the National Museum of Canada in 1948. However, he has retained a small office at the museum to enable him to record for posterity the wealth of a lifetime of research into early Canadian history.

"No one can estimate this distinguished scholar's contribution to Canada," Resources Minister Dinsdale said in a comment on the new book, published by the Queen's Printer.

"His writings preserve the folklore of all Canada, as well as the tales and songs of French Canada and the Indian cultures." The beautifully illustrated
