When Bleaching When linen pieces, or small articles of clothing, are placed upon the grass to whiten, much trouble may be prevented by spreading a strip of cheesecloth over them...

CROUTONS Cut stale bread into 1-3 or 1-2 inch slices and remove all crusts. Butter on both sides, cut into cubes and bake in the oven until brown, shaking pan frequently to obtain even color.

CHEESE STICKS Cut crusts from stale bread and butter one side, spreading with thick coating of grated cheese. Place in oven until brown. These should be passed when soup is served. Crusts may be treated in same manner.

NOODLES 1 egg 1-2 teaspoon salt Flour Stir sufficient flour into slightly-beaten egg yolk to make stiff dough. Add salt, knead and roll as thin as possible. It should be of paper-like thinness. Cover with towel and let remain untouched for half an hour.

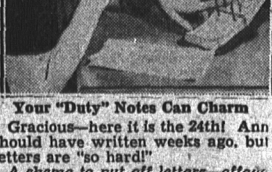
