FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR THE ARMENIANS.

New York, Nov. 8.—The Armenian relief association of this city called today to the relief committee in London, £400 sterling for the sufferers at Sassoun. A check of \$500 has been received by the association from the Duke of Westminster giving information that the London committee is still able to send funds to the region of the famine.

A Sensational Story Denied.

London, Nov. 8.—The Standard denies the sensational story published yesterday that the Turkish police had made a raid on the Selik Pasha quarter of Constantinople, were resisted, and that many lives were lost in the fighting that occurred. The Standard's correspondent telegraphed that he had visited the central prison in Constantinople, having obtained official sanction therefor, and found that rumors of wholesale arrests are untrue. He adds he is convinced that there has been no wholesale exaggeration of the number of Armenians killed in the city. Armenians of Zeiton are in open revolt against the authorities.

Five More Chinamen Lost Their Heads.

New York, Nov. 8.—A despatch from Foo Chow, China, says that five vegetable vendors in a massacre of missionaries at Twangang were publicly beheaded there yesterday morning. Before they were put to death there was an imposing ceremony in the tent of the execution grounds. The members of the American and British consular commissions, who went to Kuecheng to watch the trials, the Chinese prefect of the province, two native magistrates and many Americans and Europeans were present. Russia Threatens to Occupy Turkey.

London, Nov. 8.—The Daily News publishes a Constantinople despatch giving the details of the arrest at the post office of the servants of British merchants. The despatch says: The foreign post offices were surrounded by spies and their serious danger of conflict between them and the gendarmes. The setting of these spies and the seizure of the messengers are violations of treaty obligations. Hon. M. H. Herbert, British charge d'affaires, is moving in the matter. A cipher letter received from Elzeran states that two thousand Armenians were killed in the rioting there. A despatch from Vienna to the Daily News says it is understood if the disorders continue in Armenia the Russians in a few days will march into that country without waiting for the sanction of the powers, but a conference of European powers will be held concurrent with this move, either in Constantinople, London or Berlin.
