Reds Rush Two Tank Divisions To East Berlin

So. Koreans Regain Some Ground In Cautious Advance

By JOHN RANDOLPH SEUL (AP)—South Korean infantry advanced cautiously in the battle-devastated Kumsong river valley Friday, recovering some of the 60 square miles lost to Chinese Reds in the first open warfare in Korea in almost two years.

Reds Advanced Seven Miles

In the first disclosure of how far the Reds pushed, Gen. Maxwell Taylor, U. S. 8th army commander, said Friday that the new Kumsong front now runs from a point slightly northeast of Kumliwa due east for 20 miles to the Pukhan river. This meant an advance of up to seven miles by 80,000 Reds.

Russians Move Quickly

Alarmed by a creeping paralysis of strikes, the Russians moved quickly and menacingly. Columns of tanks began rumbling into East Berlin soon after midnight Friday.

Strike Centres

Two big strike centres were the Soviet-owned Buna synthetic rubber plant at Mersburg and the Zeiss optical works at Jena.
