 SEPTEMBER 1979 - JANUARY 1980

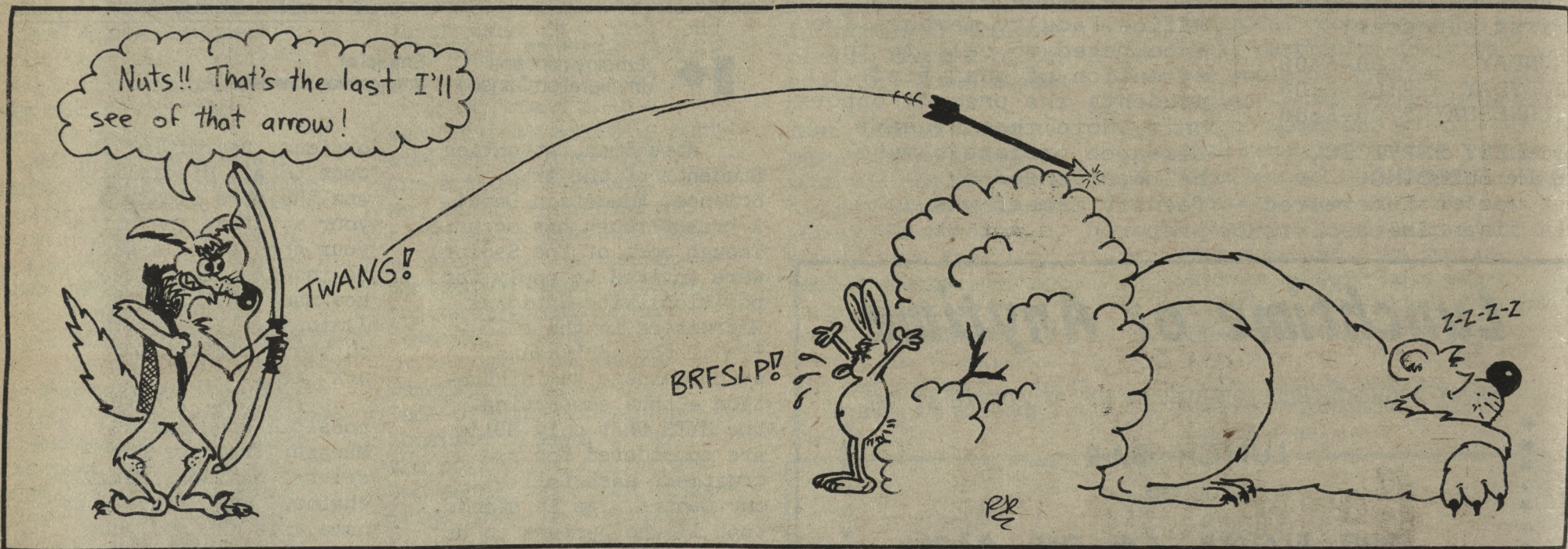

In December, 1979 the SDC gained permission from the Student Union Council to publish in The Sun, the charges brought before it, the verdicts reached and the penalties applied in each case. The names of people involved in each case will not be published at the council's request.

- Oct. 11/79: A student was charged with disorderly conduct. He was found to be guilty and fined twenty-five (25) dollars.
- Oct. 11/79: A non-student was charged with disorderly conduct. He was found to be not guilty but was reprimanded.
- Oct. 19/79: A student was charged with Drunk and disorderly conduct. He was found guilty. Penalties included a twenty-five (25) dollar fine and one month probation.
- Nov. 1/79: A student was charged with Property

Damage. For not complying with the committee's request to appear, he was fined five (5) dollars. He was found to be guilty of the charge, in his absence. Penalties included the cost of damages and suspension of Student Union privileges for the remainder of the semester. Failing to pay costs and the fine, his marks were withheld.

- Jan. 10/80: A student was charged with disorderly conduct. She was found to be not guilty.
- Jan. 10/80: A student was charged with drunk and disorderly conduct. He was found to be guilty. Penalties included a twenty-five (25) dollar fine, suspension of Student Union privileges for two weeks and probation for the remainder of the semester. He was severely reprimanded for supplying false information and implicating an innocent person.
- Jan. 21/80: A student was charged with disorderly conduct. He was found to be guilty and fined fifteen (15) dollars.

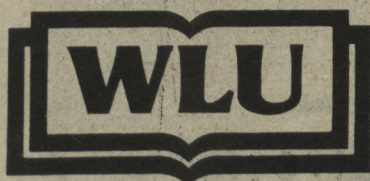

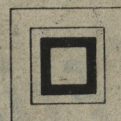
