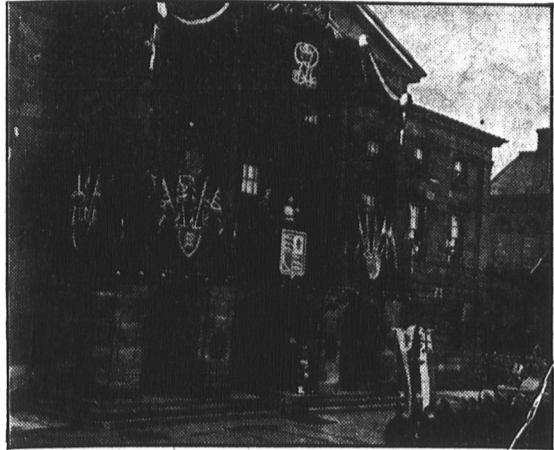

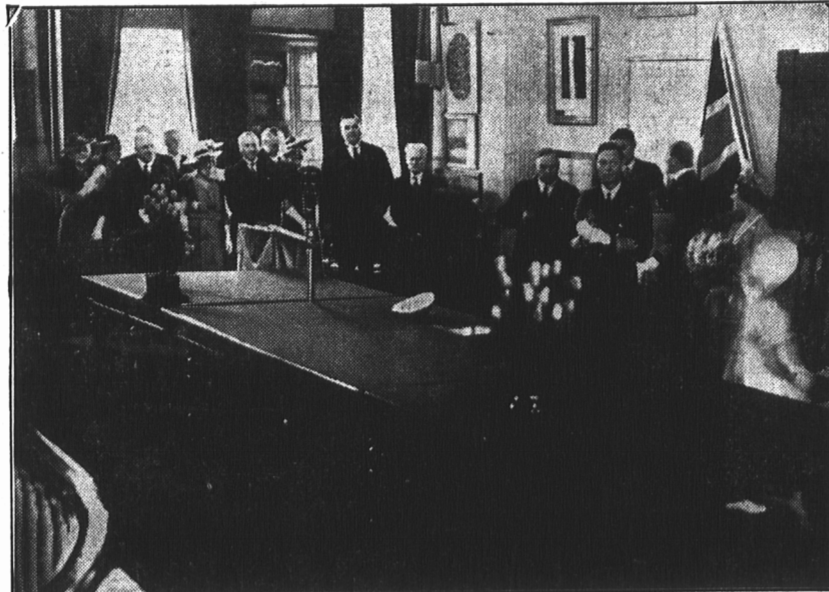
Camera Glimpses Of Their Majesties On Wednesday

From The Balcony



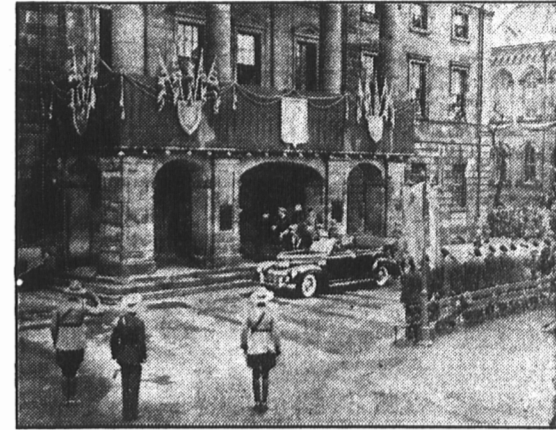
Their Majesties taking the salute from the balcony of the Provincial Building in response to the enthusiastic cheers from the populace.

Premier Campbell welcomes Their Majesties on the steps of the historic Provincial Building.



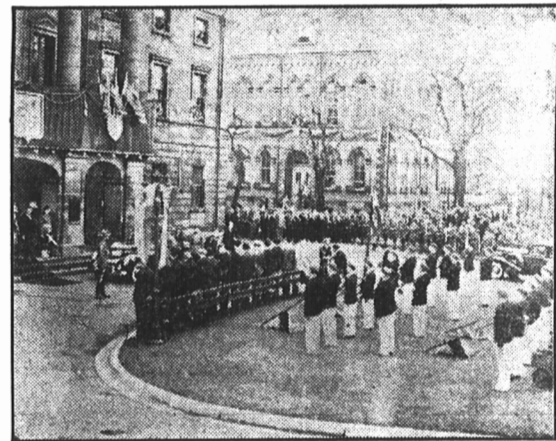
Acknowledging The Cheers

Leaving Provincial Building



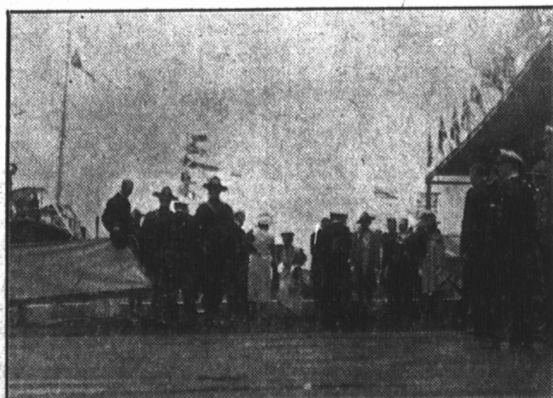
Their Majesties emerging from the Provincial Building, the Queen carrying a bouquet presented to her by little Virginia Campbell.
