TWO AMERICAN SENATES.

The Senate of the United States has 92 members representing 46 States in the equal proportion of two to each state.

The Senate of Canada is nearly as large as that of the Republic, having 87 members. Ontario sends 24 members to the Senate, Quebec 24, Nova Scotia 10, New Brunswick 10, Prince Edward Island 4, Manitoba 4, Saskatchewan 4, Alberta 4, and British Columbia 3.

The United States Senate contains 70 lawyers; the Senate of Canada 18 lawyers and 9 doctors.

Of the United States Senators all but four were born in that country and two of the four were born in Canada.

Of the Canadian Senators 69 were born in Canada, six in Scotland, four in Ireland, three in England and one in Switzerland.

The United States Senate contains but four members above the age of 80 years; the Canadian Senate has seven members above that age. These are Senators Scott, Ross, Merner, Desaulles, Carling, Bowell and De Boucherville.

The United States Senate is a much wealthier body than the Senate of Canada, and probably contains more men of world-wide reputation.

United States Senators have salaries of \$7,500 each, and are also paid mileage at 20 cents per mile to and from the capital.

Canadian Senators are paid an indemnity of \$2,500 without a mileage allowance.

THE VERDICT OF NOT GUILTY.

Twelve men on their oaths have solemnly declared that Alonzo Doherty, who shot and killed Joseph McMillan, is not guilty of murder, is in fact innocent, clean-handed, white-hearted, and has no need to ask forgiveness of God or man for what he did on that fatal night.

Is this the honest opinion of the same general public of Prince Edward Island? We do not believe that it is.

The plea of insanity in these days sweeps all before it. A man is sane before and after, but is insane just long enough to fire a house or discharge a gun.

A little extension of this convenient doctrine and we shall have all criminals insane at the time of doing unlawful things, and crime will itself be presumptive evidence of un-sound mind.

Is it coming to that? The gate is opening wide. Judged by the latest finding where can a criminal be found? But we must accept the verdict. In the eye of the law Alonzo Doherty has done no wrong. Twelve men on their oaths have said it.

The C. P. R. line recently opened northward from Toronto to Sudbury shortens by eight hours the time of travel between Toronto and Winnipeg.

The question of continuing the permanent improvement of streets and sidewalks was decided at the civic elections last winter. We are glad to find the city fathers taking action to carry on the good work.

And now the Liberal caucus at Ottawa has been considering whether or not to hold another session before dissolution. It is said the Quebec members want the elections brought on, while the Liberals of other Provinces east and west prefer to have another session. The full term of Parliament does not expire till November, 1909.
