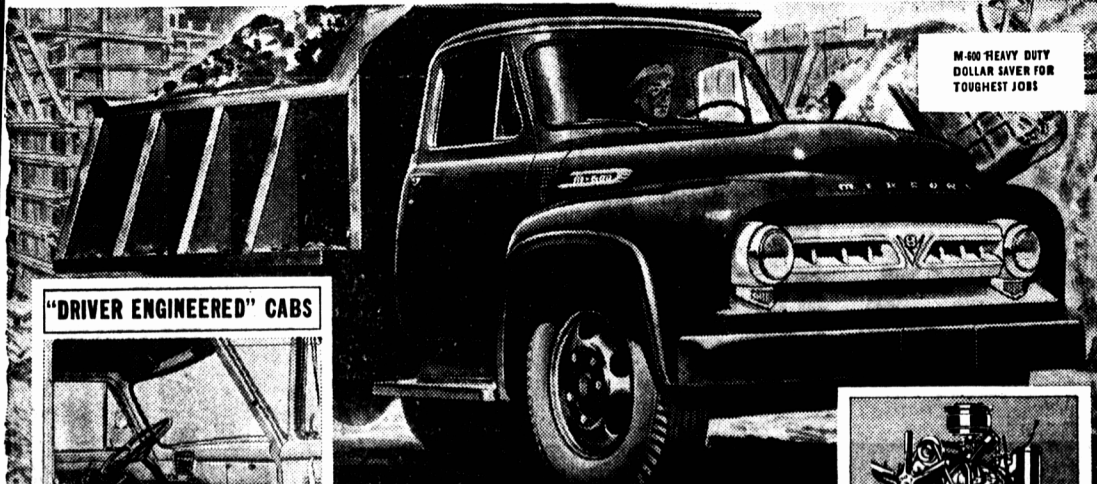

Mossadegh Warns Iraq

TEHRAN (AP)—Premier Mohammed Mossadegh's government, firmly in power after military coup by officers of the Palace Guards failed, warned neighboring Iraq Monday that playing host to the exiled Shah could cause trouble between the two countries. Shah Mohammed Reza Pahlavi and Queen Soraya fled from Iran to Baghdad Sunday in their private plane after an attempted coup by

imperial guards was put down by Mossadegh forces. In Baghdad, the Shah was quoted as telling Iraq Parliament leaders he hoped to return to his throne.
