No Winners Are Declared In Crapaud Beef Steer Judging

There were no winners in the Canada Packers beef steer judging contest at the Crapaud Exhibition this week, it was learned last night from Vernon Fraser, chief buyer for the company in this province. There was none at Alberton the previous week either, he added.

There were four Holstein steers, two Charolais, two pure bred Shorthorn steers which the company purchased at Alberton the previous week, and one grade Hereford and one grade Shorthorn at Crapaud. There was one Red and One Blue brand in the pure bred Shorthorns. There were three Standards, one Commercial and four Utility, sometimes called "plain," steers, Mr. Fraser said.

But interest in the judging is high—there were 183 entries at Crapaud—and it will be continued at Egmont Bay and Souris next week and at Dundas the following week, Mr. Fraser said.

Slams are given to those who get all of the animals placed in the correct grade. The steers are taken to the company's plant at Charlottetown and slaughtered, then graded on the rail by government grader Harold Heartz. There was one ham won in the competition at the Provincial Exhibition.

because the sidewalk is so much higher than the pavement on one side and the driveway on the other. Many believe spring water runoff will flood their cellars and property. In some cases, the sidewalk is as much as 33 inches higher than the property it passes. A paved slope will later ease the situation as far as getting in and out of properties by car.

Dept. Says Errors In Sidewalk Job

A new sidewalk job along St. Peter's Road in the Parkdale area has caused consternation

among some of the property owners, it was reported yesterday. Some of them are complaining that they will have difficulty getting their cars in and out of their property, especially in winter, because the sidewalk is so much higher than the pavement on one side and the normal level of their driveways on the other.

Many of them are fearful the spring water runoff will flood their cellars and property, and several said they would have to raise their house immediately and grade their property to a higher level.

Highways Minister J. Philip Matheson said this morning "I think mistakes have been made and added some of them will have to be corrected." The department is building the sidewalks and the Parkdale people will not have to pay for them. It won't mean any increase in their taxes, he explained.

The government is also putting in shoulders which will widen the pavement considerably on either side and installing curbs.

There will be a space of about four feet between the curb and the pavement to allow grading of driveways where the sidewalk is higher. Alex MacLennan, chairman of the village commission, said. He said one woman in the area had told him the sidewalk had protected her lawn from runoff from the highway.

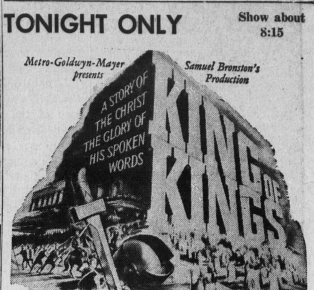

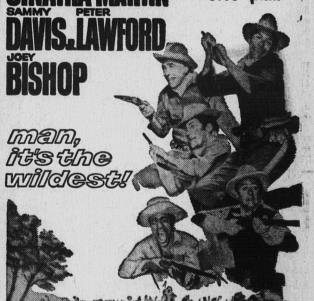

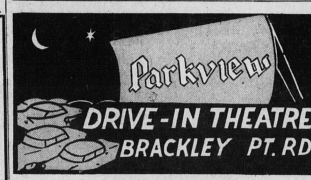
