THE FAST LINE.

Should Be Built by the C. P. R.,
Says Mr. Petersen.

Mr William Petersen, of Newcastle-on-Tyne, who failed to realize the fast Atlantic service, is in Canada on his annual tour. He states that he has spent enough time and money on the project, which, however is a necessity to Canada, and which can best be realized by the C.P.R.—that company thus rounding out its great system. Shipbuilding is very busy just now in England, and it would be some time before the project could be realized at reasonable rates. All the great yards are crowded with work, and the bounty system of the French government has had the effect of increasing the number of steamers being built. The bounty system is inimical to the English sailing ships. The bonus, given to French sailing vessels, had the effect of discouraging the building of steamers. Another law in France is, however, to be applied, giving bonuses to steamers. English capitalists are thinking that they might invest their money in this movement, with hope of large profits, for the French bounty system has been wonderfully profitable to the ship-owners.

Mr. Petersen is in favor of the project to build iron ships at Halifax in connection with the great Cape Breton, though he thinks such project could not be realized in a year.

SIX CENTS A DAY.

**Holley Does His own Cooking
and Gets fat on Meagre Diet.**

William Holley, fifty years of age, bachelor, of Brazil, Ind., has demonstrated that a man can live and thrive on six cents a day. For the last four months Holley, who lives alone and does his own cooking, has spent \$6.85 for food. He says he has gained weight. This was his bill of fare: For breakfast, coffee, meat, bread and sugar; dinner, same, with probably vegetables; supper, same as breakfast.

Each week Holley lays in a supply of food which he makes do for the entire week. This supply consists of the following:

Bread.....	15
Sugar.....	10
Meat.....	10
Coffee.....	5
Vegetables.....	5
Cost of week's food.....	45

Occasionally Holley will purchase a few substantial vegetables, such as a head of cabbage, five cent's worth of potatoes or one or two tomatoes, which could be purchased for a cent a piece, and on this allotment of food he eats three meals a day for seven days in the week, when he replenishes his supply.—Chicago Record.

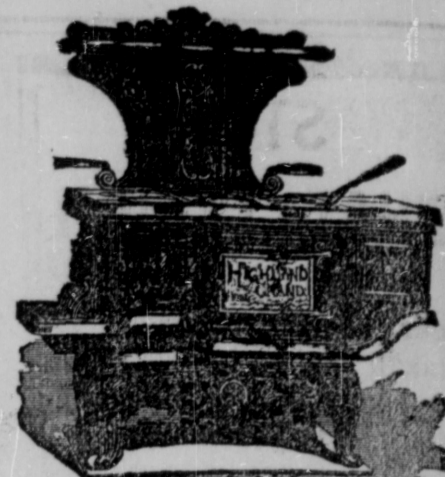
