The Island Remembers is Theatre P.E.I.'s contribution to *Canada Remembers*, a nationwide program sponsored by the federal government to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the Second World War. The show, conceived and directed by Ron Irving, was written by Michael Hennessey, with musical direction by Helen MacRae. The cast features The Venerables and Hank Stinson. They are joined by a number of other talented local actors, and the Confederation Singers under the direction of Don Fraser.

The Island Remembers honours and remembers the wartime sacrifices made by Islanders, overseas and at home. Through story and song, the show commemorates that tumultuous time fifty years ago, when World War Two changed the lives of all who were a part of it.

Patrons are invited to contribute non-perishable food items for The Food Bank. Collecting bins will be located in the theatre foyer.
