

Charlie Burns Is Voted Ontario's Top Athlete

TORONTO (CP) — Charlie Burns, who came back from a critical head injury to write a dazzling hockey success story last year, today was named Ontario's outstanding athlete of 1958 by the Ontario Sports Writers and Sportsmen's Association.

A year ago, Burns was named outstanding player in the world hockey championship at Oslo when he helped Whitby Dunlops bring the title back to Canada. Last fall, he successfully made the jump to National Hockey League ranks with Detroit Red Wings.

The 47 association members participating in the voting made the 22-year-old forward a narrow choice over Ron Howell, brilliant

native-born end of Hamilton Tiger-Cats in the Big Four Football Union.

CAREER WASHED UP

Burns, a native of Detroit who was brought up in Toronto, suffered a double skull fracture and blood clot on the brain in practice with Toronto Marlboro Juniors of the Ontario Hockey Association before the 1954-55 season. For a time it was feared he might not recover. And when he did, after a delicate brain operation, doctors doubted he would ever play any sport again.

With a silver plate in his skull he was playing baseball two months after leaving hospital. Then he returned to hockey. First, he played in a Toronto in-

dustrial league when Marlboros declined to take a chance on another injury. Then he was accepted by Marlboros, wearing a special helmet for protection, and he helped them win the Canadian Junior championship.

In 1957, he helped Whitby win the Allan Cup and played in the world tournament last year, giving up a chance at a professional baseball tryout to stick to hockey.

He is the first team player to win the award since it was inaugurated in 1951. The other winners were golfers Al Balding, (twice), Marlene Stewart Street, (three times), and Gerry Kesselring and swimmer Marilyn Bell.

For the first time in the history of harness racing in Canada, a Canadian-bred two-year-old trotted in 2.10, and it was on a Canadian track. The new record holder is Dallye Blue, a bay filly by Ezra Blue 2:06 1/4, dam Sheila Lee 2:10; by Lee Harvester.

Dallye Blue was broken in late December of 1957 and was trained in the Ottawa Valley section of Ontario where it is often extremely cold and ice continues until quite well on in the spring.

She made her first start on July 25 at Arnprior, Ontario, in the 2.30 Class and won in 2:17 1/5 and 2:14 3/5; it was the fastest mile of the meet. In her next start she was nosed out by Harry Riddell at Woodbine Raceway, Toronto, in a two-year-old event. The time was 2:12 4/5. This was a new Canadian record for two-year-old trotters, but it didn't stay on the books very long.

RECORDS FALL

World's harness racing records fell by the wayside at Yonkers Raceway, New York, when the last meeting was concluded on November 29th. The season's betting "handle" was \$190,683,574, which broke Roosevelt Raceway's mark of \$184,250,273 set this year.

John Quinn Quits Braves Hamey Goes To Yankees

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — John Quinn quit as general manager of the National League champion Milwaukee Braves Tuesday.

He becomes vice-president and general manager of the last place Philadelphia Phillies, succeeding H. Roy Hamey who resigned to return to the world champion New York Yankees as assistant general manager.

Announcement of the triple play involving the three major league clubs was made almost simultaneously in Philadelphia, Milwaukee and New York. Quinn has a five year contract and the unenviable assignment of leading the Phillies out of the wilderness.

Bob Carpenter, president and

owner of the Phillies, disclosed that Hamey had decided to go back with the Yankees with whom he spent 17 of his 34 years in baseball. Hamey will be first assistant to George Weiss, general manager of the Yankees. He will handle player signings and supervise activities of the farm system.

DIFFICULT DECISION

In Milwaukee, Quinn said it was a difficult decision to make. "Bob Carpenter offered me a proposition I just didn't feel I could turn down."

Quinn denied that his leave taking of the Braves was prompted by the recent appointment of George (Birdie) Tappetta

as executive vice-president of, and heir apparent to, the presidency of the Milwaukee club.

Although it is known Quinn was deeply hurt by the Tebbetts disappointment, the man under whose executive leadership the Braves won three pennants and one world title, and finished in the first division 14 of the past 15 years, insisted he was leaving only for a better job.
