Planning Is Near Completion For Emergency Rationing

OTTAWA (CP)—Planning is nearing completion for a national organized agency that would take over control of pricing, distributing and rationing essential supply items in the event of a nuclear assault on Canada.

G. E. Woodside, acting director of the emergency supply planning branch, said here today that the agency and its committees authority to take control of essential foods, clothing, fuel and equipment.

In addition to zone organizations, there is a committee for each major city and a supervising group for each province. Members of the committees are drawn from business, industry and local government. Provincial and municipal authorities co-operated in selecting them.
