

# Archer Defeats Blair Richardson

**NEW YORK (CP)** — Joey Archer, a Bronx Irishman ranked sixth among world middleweight contenders, won a unanimous boxing decision Saturday night to spoil the Madison Square Garden debut of Canadian middleweight champion Blair Richardson.

Richardson, a handsome blonde 22-year-old college student from South Bay, N.S., has a reputation as a hard-hitting puncher but proved unable to tag the elusive Archer in the 10-round bout.

Archer, 30-1 favorite, scored with close to 200 left jabs and other assorted punches, but all there were no knockdowns.

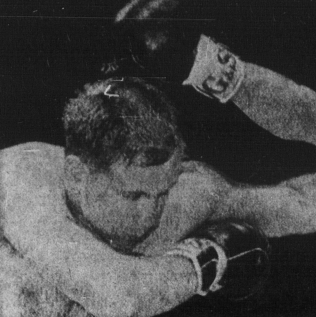
All three officials had Archer 23, needed by huge margins.

Archer weighed 160 pounds to Richardson's 158½.

Young who earlier in the second period drew a major foul clashing blood when he high-sticked J. C. Tremblay, held his stick at 10:12 of the same

period and was given a minor, Young was a game misconduct.

The 27 penalty minutes in the period boosted him to 310 for the season, surpassing the 1955-56 record of Lou Fontinato who was then with New York.

The hot-tempered Young, who hadn't drawn a misconduct all season and only three majors, failed a swing at referee Frank Udvari while on route to the penalty box and then threatened to referee verbally and physically with several teammates held him back.
