The regals came on strong in the second and third periods to take command. Ray Ross opened the scoring for Guelph at 8:30 of the second period, when he handed a gift from Larry Douin in front of the Sherbrooke nets having no trouble blasting the puck by the goalie. Walt Bradley of Guelph tied the count 3-3 when he deflected Rick McClarkin's shot past the Sherbrooke goalie. In the final period both teams had good scoring chances before Dick Cherry picked up a loose puck in front of the goal and slid it into the net at the 16:03 mark to give Guelph the lead and the game.

### Barons, Ameriks Capture Matches

 Howie Glover and Mike Walton were the heroes Saturday as Cleveland Barons and Rochester Americans won semi-final games in the American Hockey League.  
 Glover scored a second-period goal as the Barons defeated Springfield Indians 1-0 while Walton scored two goals in a six-goal third period as the Americans defeated Quebec Aces 7-2.  
 Cleveland leads its best-of-five series 2-0 while the Rochester-Barons best-of-seven series is tied 2-2.  
 Glover was sliding on his stomach as he lunged at the puck and swept it past goalie Jacques Caron from about eight feet out.  
 Walton triggered a Rochester comeback by tying the score 2-2 with 3 1/2 minutes gone in the final period. Gerry Ehman shot the Americans ahead less than a minute later and Walton scored again before the 10-minute mark.  
 Larry Jeffrey, who had assisted on two earlier goals, connected for a 5-2 Rochester lead, and Brian Conacher and Darryl Edstrand completed the rout.
