A MISNOMER.

MILNER'S EXPOSE OF THE PRO-BOER CONCILIATION MOVE.

An important blue book relating to South Africa has been published by the Colonial Office. It consists of a large mass of despatches and other documents bearing dates between December and June last.

In an admirably reasoned despatch to Mr. Chamberlain, dated June 6, Sir A. Milner dealt with the so-called "People's Congress," held at Graat Reint at the end of May, among the delegates to which was Mr. Hargrove.

"I do not know to what extent the 'conciliation' movement many have attracted attention in England," he wrote, "but I am bound to inform you that in my judgement, whatever may be the extent of its importance (as to which I do not feel at all sure), it makes for mischief and mischief only."

The High Commissioner next draws attention to the fact that "a very unpleasant and characteristic feature of the 'conciliation' movement is the threat to boycott the English in commercial relations," but shows that such a course would probably be followed by a retaliatory movement on the part of the British in which case the Dutch in the country districts would be the chief sufferers.

But despite everything Sir A. Milner observes:—"I do not myself take a very gloomy view of the prospect of racial relations in the colony, much less in South Africa generally."

Sir Alfred Milner, in a despatch dated April 25, deals with the statements made by the Boer apologists on this side that the Orange Free State never annexed any portion of Cape Colony or Natal.

From facts cited by the High Commissioner, based on enquiries made in districts formerly occupied by the enemy, it is conclusively proved that although the word "annexation" was studiously avoided by President Steyn in his proclamations, the chiefs of the invading commandoes, acting under their instructions, consistently declared the districts which they occupied to be Republic territory, and the inhabitants burghers of the Republics, and as such liable to be commandeered.

Abundant documentary evidence is given which puts this beyond doubt.

FROM THE BATTLEFIELD.

From the field of battle a cheque was received at Ottawa a few days ago by Mayor Payment for the relief of the fire sufferers. The money, amounting to £10, was collected in the field near Bloemfontein by the Northumberland Fusiliers. The Mayor also received a cheque for £20 from Mr. H. Wagner, of the Ceylon Indian Standard, accompanied by an expression of sympathy for the sufferers.

PACIFICATION. (New York 'Evening Post')

The utter failure of the amnesty celebration in Manila contrasts strikingly with the apparent success of the British in pacifying the disturbed parts of South Africa. We have heard less of Lord Roberts's movements since the troubles in China have come to the front, but if the press reports are to be believed he is not only steadily pushing forward the conquest of the country, but also, in a large measure, leaving order and civil government in his train.

the Philippines have something to learn about the business of handling subject races. Lord Roberts has not talked much about either 'benevolent assimilation' or the 'strong arm of authority, but somehow or other he seems to be attaining the one and using the other with marked success.

A cable was received from Colonel Otter, dated Johannesburg August 1st the effective strength of the First Canadian contingent is increasing, and that it now numbers 700 men fit for the field. There is a wonderful improvement in five weeks. By to-day's mail letters dated June 12 were received stating there were 546 men of the regiment then in hospital sick and only 434 fit for duty.
