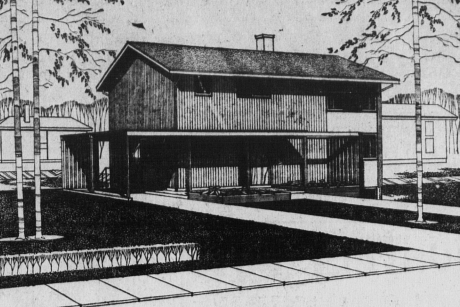

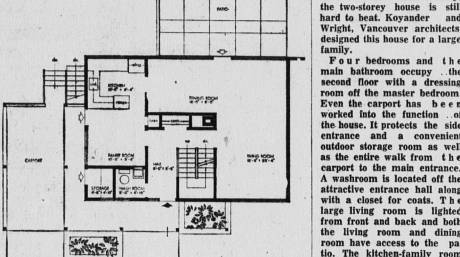

TWO STOREYS PROVIDE ECONOMICAL SPACE



WHERE SPACE must go hand in hand with economy, the two-storey house is still hard to beat. Koyander & Wright, Vancouver architects, designed this house for a large family.



Four bedrooms and the main bathroom occupy the second floor with a dressing room off the master bedroom. Even the carpet has been worked into the function of the house. It protects the side entrance and a convenient outdoor storage room as well as the entire walk from the carport to the main entrance. Washroom is located off the attractive entrance hall along with a closet for coats. 7 x 6 large living room is lighted from front and back and both the living room and dining room have access to the patio. The kitchen-family room arrangement and the outside entrance to the basement are other large family considerations.

The floor area is 1,680 square feet and the exterior dimensions 35 feet by 24 feet. Working drawings for this house, known as Design 668, are available from Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation in Moncton at minimum cost.

FIRST AID FOR HOMES

BY ROGER C. WHITMAN GAS STOVE ODORS Question: After installing a gas stove, I have noticed that the odor is becoming more and more bothersome. What can I do to get rid of it? Answer: It is possible that the valves are sized for natural gas, not the bottled gas you are using. Check with the manufacturer or a competent inspector.

RESTORING CEDAR ARCHA Question: We have a cedar chest of drawers that is 40 years old. The drawers are warped and the wood is discolored. How can we restore it? Answer: Scrape and sand down all wood surfaces to expose fresh cedar wood. Or aromatic cedar sprays are available at many housewares and hardware dealers.

BUBBLE BATH STAIN Question: Last summer you had an item about removing a "bubble bath" stain in the bathtub. At that time we had no tub. Now we have one. We tried household cleansers and bleach powder to no avail. Could you repeat the best suggestion is that you write the manufacturer of your tub for a recommendation. The following treatment may work: a thick paste of scotchless scouring powder, a little cream of tartar and peroxide. Rub the discolored area with a thick layer of this, allow to remain about a half hour, then scrub with a stiff brush. Rinse thoroughly with clean water. Repeat if necessary, several times.

KITCHEN SET Question: We have just replaced our kitchen table and chairs with a new set and wonder if there is a standard chrome and formica could be used outdoors? Could it be left outdoors as is or need treatment of some kind to resist rusting, etc.? It is now in a very dry climate.

Answer: Both chrome and formica are highly resistant to weather, especially the chrome (for proof look at your bumper). There should be no problem about exposure. However, you bolts, bolt holes, nuts, etc., which are not chrome should be protected by dabbing an asphaltum preservative, while the laminated plastic top in itself is impervious, you must thoroughly close all seams to prevent moisture working underneath where it could cause damage.

CRACKED FIELDS STONE Question: How can I repair cracks in my field stone front? Some cracks are thin enough to put your finger nail in and others are a little larger. Would they both be fixed alike? In repairing the cracks, how can I obtain the different colors of cement originally used? Answer: Use a latex patching concrete available in large hardware and masonry supplies dealers, to fill all the cracks. Then touch up the cracks (when patch has thoroughly dried) with a matching, rubber bristled exterior paint.

COVERING OVER LINOLEUM Question: We have a very smooth linoleum on our kitchen floor, solid piece, no loose places at all. We want to put on a block-type covering. Can this be applied right over the linoleum, or must plywood be put on first? Answer: If the present linoleum is adhered tightly all over and is smooth, as you say, then the block-type covering can be put down over the adhesive recommended by the manufacturer and following his installation instructions carefully. The present floor surface must be absolutely free of grease, wax, grime, etc., before recovering. Although usually successful when done carefully, floor covering manufacturers do not recommend this practice. The reason is that if the adhesive under the linoleum and the tiles will be affected.

BRICK FACING STEPS Question: We have a solid cement steps to the front of our home that have sunk down six to eight inches. In trying to think of inexpensive ways to fix these we hit upon the idea of brick facing. Is this practical, possible and if so, where could we get some ideas on this?
