What Of The Future?

Lack of cheap power has also worked against cheaper and more efficient production, the scarcity of farm labor has forced farmers into heavy expenditures for machinery, creating problems of financing and the necessity of acquiring more land to support machinery.

For those who like to dream or look into the future, speculation on the Island's future can be interesting, possibly profitable, that the mineral resources present in Eastern Canada will be developed with consequent increase in industry and population, seems almost certain.

At the moment, Prince Edward Island is ringed about by deficiency food producing areas, as the years go by our production will be in increasing demand and the incentive to increase production and farm more intensively become greater and greater.

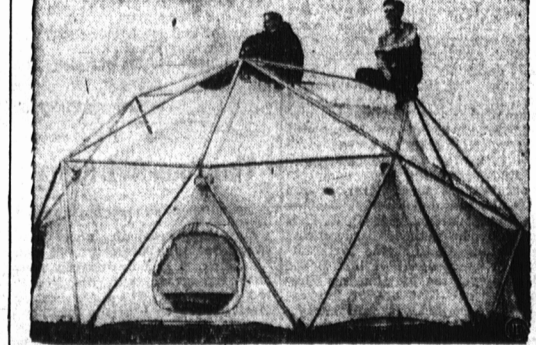

Continued from page 2 eyes, as well as in her own. This condition definitely will not improve, but will become much worse with marriage. Need I say more? DEAR MISS DIX: At 29 I am a high-school teacher, and have become very interested in one of my pupils—a boy of 16. He comes to see me every chance he gets, so I conclude he is interested in me, too. It would be hard for me to stop seeing him, but do you advise such a course? ANSWER: You are doing a most foolhardy thing, both from your own standpoint and from the boy's. No 16-year-old boy could be seriously interested in a woman almost twice his age. His feeling toward you is simply a form of schoolboy crush and will inevitably pass. Better treat it in the same way or serious trouble is in store for you. If knowledge of your attachment reaches the wrong quarters, it might mean the loss of your job. DEAR DOROTHY DIX: I have been going with a nice boy but my mother does not approve of him as she claims he drinks too much. Actually, he doesn't take more than four or five drinks when he is with me. Because my father was a heavy drinker, mother has the same idea about any man who takes a drink. ANSWER: Haven't you sense enough to profit from experience—even if the experience is that of someone else? Your mother is absolutely correct in her warnings. Four or five drinks is much too much for a young man to take, in fact, even one drink can often be too much. If you don't want to store up misery for yourself, follow mom's advice and let the young man go. DEAR MISS DIX: Since my mother-in-law died six months ago, my husband, who is in his forties, has been so grief stricken that he is losing all interest in his own home and family. I've never seen a situation like this before. He is acting almost childishly, and doesn't want us to have any pleasure in the house at all. He feels it's being disloyal to his mother's memory. K. N. ANSWER: While grief over a parent's death is certainly understandable, your husband's attitude seems to verge on a guilt complex. Does he feel that perhaps he didn't do enough for his mother while she was alive? If he continues as he is now, he may become mentally ill, and I strongly advise you to have him see either a trusted physician or a minister. Either one could put his mind at rest and the grief that is apparently due more to his own shortcomings than to the actual loss of his mother. INSIDE-OUT TENT KEEPS STORMS OUTSIDE — This new-type tent, built inside-out so blizzards won't blow it away, will get a field test next summer when members of the Arctic Institute of North America visit the Penny Ice-cap on Baffin Island. Designed by Jeffrey Lindsay and Ted Pope of the Fuller Research Foundation, it consists of an aluminum tubing exterior framework from which is hung the tent. There are no interior support poles. The tent, demonstrated at Montreal, Canada, can be erected by two men in 25 minutes.
