BUILDING ROADS TO OPPORTUNITY

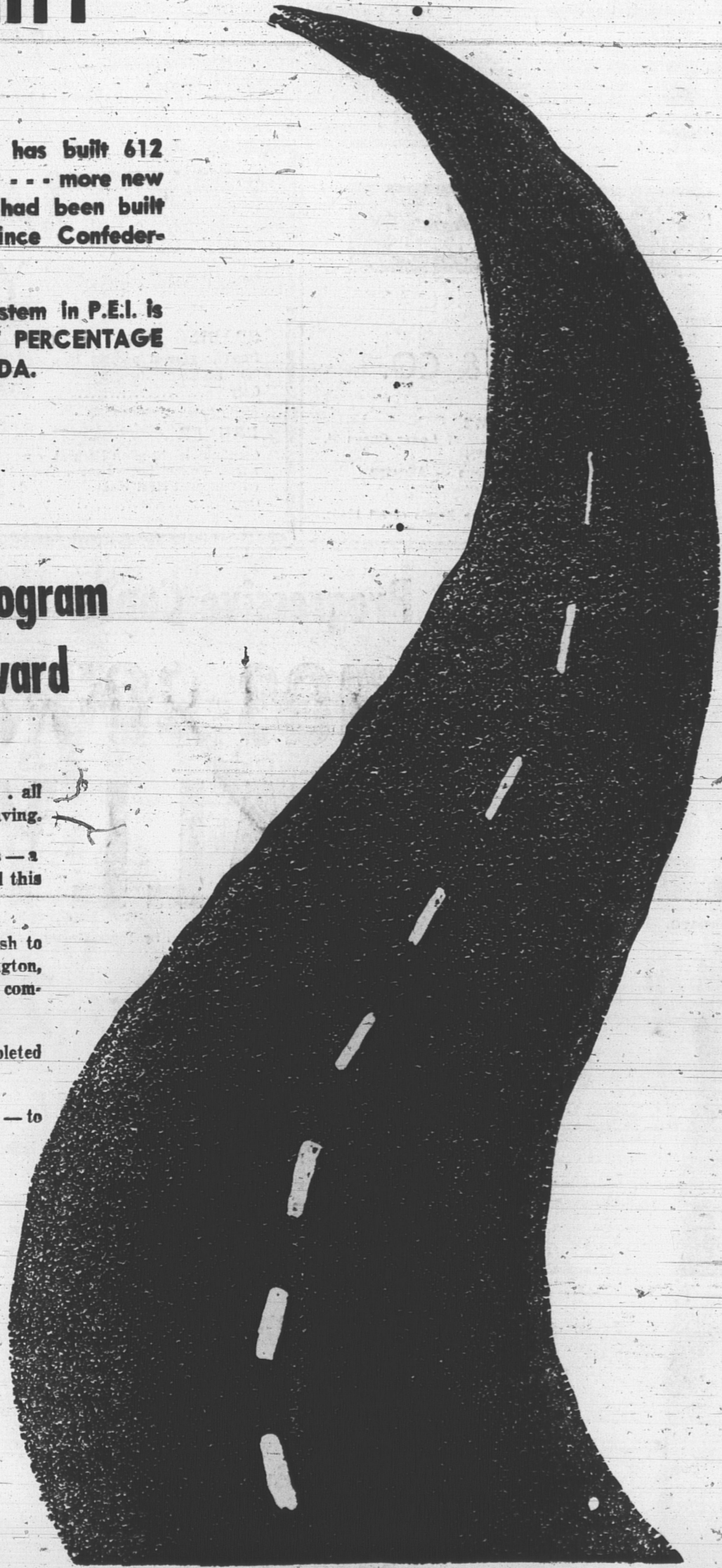

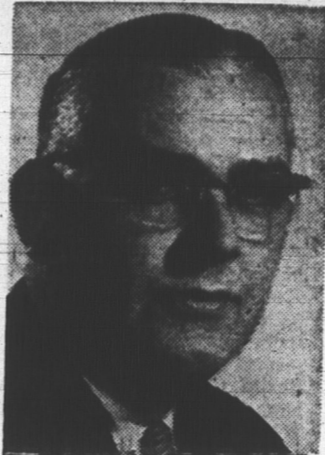

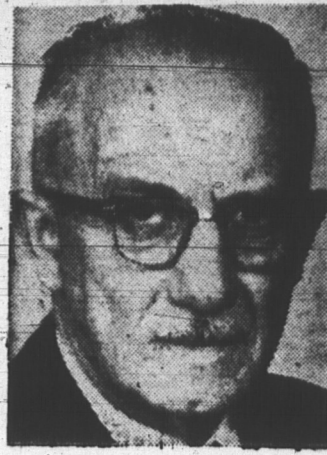
