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CHAIRMAN SPEAKS

Republicans Urged to Quit Bickering

WASHINGTON (AP) — Dean Burch, Republican party chairman, has urged party leaders to quit bickering in a national meeting here today.

But even as he spoke there was fresh criticism of the conservative leadership of Senator Barry Goldwater, the party's presidential nominee who went down in a resounding defeat in Tuesday's election.

The skirmishing could lead to a rekindling of drive by Republican liberals and moderns to recapture control of the party which went to Barry Goldwater at the Republican presidential nominating convention in Atlantic City last year.

Burch, in his plea for party unity amid the post-election shambles, said he will call a national committee meeting after Jan. 1 to discuss "all questions of importance to the party, including that of his chairmanship."

It took a week to lead, not to dictate, and I will continue that leadership as long as the Republican party wants me to be there.

At least one state Republican leader had different ideas. Wisconsin Chairman Talbot Peterson suggested former vice-president Richard M. Nixon for the job.

Peterson said Goldwater's candidacy had carried to defeat a number of Republican hopefuls, including Wilbur Brink, the state's governor.

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Power Systems Integration Suggested For U.S., Canada

WINNIPEG (CP) — Canada and the United States could gain from integration of electric power systems, J. C. Swidler, chairman of the U.S. Federal power commission, said here.

He told the 11th annual mid-west area power conference about 50,000,000 kilowatt hours could be considered available for export from Canada to the United States on a competitive basis with American supplies.

He said the figure was not a prediction but merely illustrated the maximum possible power flow from north to south.

He said there is a wide-world trend toward integration of national power facilities. He noted the existence of a group known as the Field-Centennial Area Power Planners, comprising mid-west power utilities from the United States and Manitoba.

He said the group's aim is to provide for integrated planning. Great possibilities exist for the development of hydro-electric water resources in North America. Nuclear power developments have not rendered this unnecessary.

Many water development projects will be developed in Canada. At the same time many hydro-electric sites in Canada, too big for Canada to use alone, could supply power to the United States.

He said possibilities include the Nelson River project in Manitoba, the Hamilton River in Newfoundland and the Peace River in British Columbia.

Mr. Swidler said the United States market could provide an outlet for Canadian surplus and a valuable backup for Canadian power systems.
