(Continued from page one) and strong winds knocked poles down in several areas, and trees which had been accepted from their branches are snapping power lines heavily causing many breaks in the wires. The worst problem faced by men trying to repair damages is the heavy travelling conditions making it nearly impossible for trucks to move to trouble spots.

The area from New Haven to North River which was a blocked out for hours was reported back on at midnight as was Dunstons. The Cherry Valley area was still blocked out because of several poles which were down and several wires were still over at Mr. Stewart and trucks were stuck trying to reach the area. Street lights in the Souris area are out but house lights were on.

In Souris, all roads a and streets were blocked. The C.N.R. mail truck did not arrive and the staff of Air Marshal Island Telephone Company reported several isolated breaks, mostly from wires pulling from the sides of the houses, but no major service losses in any one area.

(Continued from page one) want to be Canadians, and there must be no returning home. If Canada is to be built strong, we must all become Canadians, not English, not French, Irish Scots or anything else.

Many people in Canada who want to be Canadians are of nationalities which are very strong by attached to their traditions but they are not going to start a civil war to defend these. These people have come to contribute, not to dominate, and they want to be Canadians, not English, French, Irish Scots or anything else.

A confused history has confused Canadian thought and many French teachers should remind students of the place for compromise and coexistence in the development of this country, but that compromise and coexistence are a two way deal, and that no one person or group can have all its own way in building the country.

"Not only has times changed," Dr. Long said, "but new Canadians who are presently

close to one third the population will soon be that and more, and that the French speaking Canadian who is sensible enough to give up the reverence of the cradle and cannot import enough Frenchmen to maintain his balance will soon be only one quarter of the population.

He said everyone must share responsibility for the past, we must admit it, and we must also share a common responsibility for the future.

Dr. Long compared Canada with several other countries with language and customs problems between two or more groups. Canada cannot live without Quebec and Quebec cannot survive isolated from Canada. A new Canada cannot understand the field of extremists who think the past more important than the future.
