## Unscrupulous Sales Work Checked In Saskatchewan

Its professor, the Commercial Agents Act of 1958, but included against fly-by-night and unscrupulous door-to-door salesmen has proved more successful than anticipated, says Attorney General D. V. Heald of Saskatchewan.

The Direct Sellers Act, requiring the bonding and licensing of all firms and salesmen engaged in such sales, became effective July 1, 1965, and Mr. Heald said \$50,000 is a conservative amount returned to people under a section which allows goods or services sold on a contract basis to be returned or refused within four days without obligation.

The legislation was designed primarily to curb a minority of unethical door-to-door salesmen. It embodies many provisions of the provincial secretary's department.

Under the legislation a company selling goods or services door-to-door must post a bond of \$10,000 if its product is

The act stipulates any goods or services must be delivered within 120 days of the contract's execution. This measure has virtually eliminated "lay away" sales schemes at the door-to-door level.

Jack Nichol, one-time salesman, is responsible for enforcement of the act in his capacity as director of investigations for the provincial secretary's department.

valued at \$200 or more, it then pays a licence fee for its salesmen. A 100 licence covers five or more salesmen.

"We have no trouble with old established direct sellers such as the brush men, the door-to-door cosmetic seller and similar firms usually having individual sales of less than \$100 a call," Mr. Nichol said.

The magnitude of direct selling in the province, Mr. Nichol said, is shown in estimated sales of \$15,000,000 in 1965.

A salesman cannot be licensed unless the firm he represents is registered and bonded. It costs \$5 for a licence if these conditions are met. An independent salesman is required to post a \$1,000 bond and pay a \$25 licence fee. Regulations provide a scale of licence fees salesmen must pay to cities, towns and villages.

## EDUCATE PUBLIC

"Fly-by-night operators still enter the province, make sales and then skip back to another province with impunity, but we hope to educate the public to ask salesmen to produce valid licences," Mr. Nichol said.

"We'll have the problem well in hand when people learn they have no recourse against unlicensed salesmen."

Penalties for unlicensed operators are not less than \$25 or more than \$100 for a first offence and not less than \$50 or more than \$200 for subsequent convictions.

Mr. Nichol said there have been a number of convictions under the act and one man was jailed for one year under the Criminal Code for making a false declaration on an application for a salesman's licence.
