development board would be given three main duties:

- 1. Report to the government on long-term prospects and potentialities of the economy's growth and for particular industries and regions.
2. Find methods of stimulating growth in industries that would further advance the economy.

The bill also stipulates that the board would have the powers of a commission in conducting inquiries toward its ends. It would conduct studies and have them published.

"To the greatest possible extent consistent with the performance of its duties," the board would co-operate with the National Productivity Council, the yet-to-be-formed Atlantic development board and other government agencies with similar functions.

PLAN 10-YEAR TERM
The chairman would be elected for a 10-year term and would be the only paid official. The other members would act without pay except for expenses. Most terms would be three years.

Provision is made for a working staff and for hiring on a temporary basis any staff needed to work on technical or specialized projects.

In his criticism of the proposed board, Mr. Douglas said he doubts it would be effective. "It is too much like the production planning committee which makes a bow in the direction of economic planning but give no indication of a serious intention to do the kind of economic planning which is necessary if this country is to be put on its feet economically," he said.

To be effective, he said, the board would have to exercise control over monopolies and gigantic corporations."

Special Classes Said Needed
For Slow Learners In School

The November meeting of the Spring Park Home and School Association was highlighted by an address given by Dr. M.N. Beck on "The slow learner."

Dr. Beck explained to the members the three types of slow learners. First, those whose mental age is behind the chronological age. Second, those with a specific reading disability, which can occur at any level of intelligence regardless of the IQ. Third, those with a social and emotional problem, which also inhibits progress in school.

Dr. Beck dealt mainly with those who have a specific reading disability and told of large percentage of children in schools with such a problem. Again he emphasized the need for special classes in all our schools.

In the absence of the principal, Mrs. Marjorie Dover, who is attending a seminar in Ottawa on the teaching of a second modern language in the schools, Mrs. Grace McKinnon gave the principal's report.

Mrs. Earl Norrie reported on the afternoon session of the semi-annual meeting of the P.E.I. Federation of the Home P.E.I. and School Association which was held in Morell.

Mrs. McKinnon's class was the attendance award.

All facilities, and activities of the centre, will be provided free by the Kinsmen Club of Charlottetown.

The property purchased is located on the corner of Fitzroy and Queen streets across from the Island Telephone Co. office. It was formerly known as the Messervy property.

In the spring of 1963 the outside of the centre will be redecorated.

It is planned to have individual and separate lounges on the ground floor. Two of the lounges have fireplaces. Also located on the first floor will be a kitchen.

The second floor will be a library, reading room and hobby room. A TV lounge is also planned.
