DIVISION DAY

An agitation is being developed in Canada to have Dominion Day observed on the Monday nearest July 1. The promoters of this plan are no doubt desirous of adding another long weekend holiday to the list of occasions when traffic fatalities revolt the nation. No doubt before such a change is considered—and any action taken the Governments of all provinces will be consulted.

HOSPITAL INSURANCE

The Federation of Agriculture notes with satisfaction and approval the announcement contained in the speech from the throne that a general plan of Hospital Insurance will be introduced.

JUNIOR WORK

The 4-H Club movement in this province is making a valuable contribution to improved citizenship and the development of young people who will be the future leaders in agriculture.

SOCIAL-ECONOMIC STUDIES

It will be recalled that in our brief last year we requested the support of the Department of Agriculture and the Government in the setting up of a number of Socio-Economic Studies of rural

communities. The announcement made by the Minister of Agriculture to the effect that arrangements are now under way for the carrying out of these surveys is one of very great satisfaction to us. We believe these studies can be of great significance and urge that they be carried forward with all possible dispatch.

HUNTING PRIVILEGES

Instances arise of hunters both rural and urban taking unjustified privileges in hunting over farm property. We realize that most hunters are courteous and desirous of maintaining good relations with property owners. However, there are exceptions and it is in these instances where the farmer requires protection. True the farmer may bring action for trespass but it is extremely difficult to obtain convictions on such charges. It is believed that if the Game Act contained a section stating that hunters should obtain permission before entering on private property that in cases where the property owner feels himself to be aggrieved the hunter will be in the position of having to prove that he was not trespassing rather than the farmer proving that he was.

UNIFORM TIME

The Federation and the farm people of the province note the continuing agitation on the part of our towns for "Daylight Saving Time." We find this a very puzzling matter and are completely at a loss to understand the real reason behind it. The benefits to be derived from fast time, if any, are of such an unimportant nature that they certainly don't appear to justify the campaign which is being conducted.

This organization has for a number of years offered its members, for a premium of \$5 per year a very satisfactory accident insurance plan. Although this plan has been well publicized and actively promoted there has never been more than one thousand farmers carried it. In our opinion it will require a very well organized effort to ensure the success of a hospital insurance plan under a premium system.

ST. LAWRENCE SEAWAY

It is with amazement that we have learned that the first apparent effect of the St. Lawrence Seaway on the Atlantic Provinces will be to increase by over \$300,000 our flour bill and our feed wheat by \$2 per ton. We support the action of this Government in protesting through the Maritime Transportation Commission the application by the

comprehensive land use policy is noted and approved. In addition conservation of all our natural resources; soil, water and wild life is of great if not always appreciated importance to all citizens. The Women's Institute of the province are presently studying conservation and are deserving of praise for their interest in this matter.

M. V. INSURANCE

In spite of the continued improvement of our road system, increasing number of motor vehicles add to the hazard of highway travel and last year produced a very disturbing total and increase in traffic fatalities. We are concerned with the fact that a very high percentage of vehicle owners carry no public liability insurance. This is not a good situation and is one that is not covered by the Unsatisfied Judgment Fund. We therefore recommend that a study should be made on the desirability of making the registration of motor vehicles conditional upon the owner holding liability insurance.

UNEMPLOYMENT

The provision of unemployment insurance for farm workers is developing increased support. The Canadian Federation of Agriculture has never been prepared to recommend the general application of unemployment insurance on a compulsory basis to farm workers as it is felt many farmers would be unwilling to do the paper work involved. Further there are circumstances where insurance might mean less, not more help for farmers.

Briefly Federation policy on this matter at the present time is that insurance should be made available to workers in branches of agriculture which can be clearly defined by nature of the production or geographically and where a clearly established demand exists for the application of unemployment insurance.
