Douglas Pushes For Medicare

OTTAWA (CP)—A universal medical care insurance program should be introduced in 1966, New Democratic Leader T. C. Douglas says in a new year's message.

Medical insurance and an increase in old age security to \$100 a month payable from age 65 were needed without delay to bring about a more equitable distribution of purchasing power among Canadians. Mr. and Mrs. Douglas are vacationing in Jamaica.

The statement says the 21 New Democrats in the new Parliament will press the government to take the following measures in 1966:

- Massive aid to universities and vocational and trade schools to permit the abolition of tuition fees.
- Creation of a Canada development corporation to channel Canadian savings into industrial investments.
- Full collective bargaining rights for federal civil servants.
- A review of all labor laws to ensure that labor will be consulted about the effects of automation and be given a fair share of the resulting economies.

ASKS PEACE
 MOSCOW (AP) — Patriarch Alexius of Moscow and all Russia, head of the Russian Orthodox Church in the Soviet Union, has called upon the faithful in his Christmas and New Year's message to pray for peace, the news agency Tass reported Monday. The patriarch's message said the "defence of peace is the duty of every Christian."
