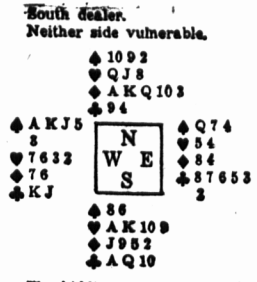

New Brunswick Improves Teacher License System

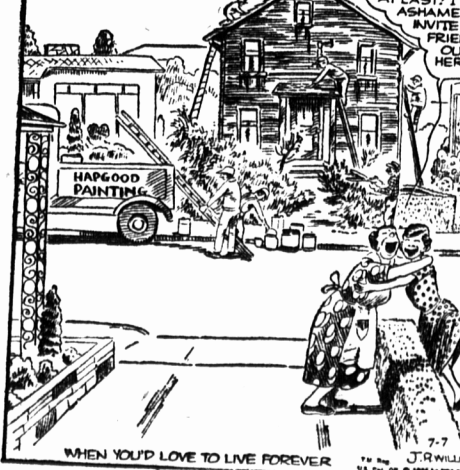

When the House was dissolved, the standing was CCF 41, Liberals 10, Progressive Conservatives one and vacant one.

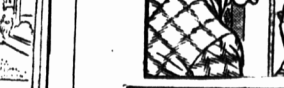
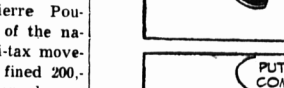
