Coal Production Declines In N.S.

HALIFAX (CP) — Net coal production in Nova Scotia declined by six per cent during 1961 but production efficiency increased to a record high. It was disclosed in the annual report of the Nova Scotia mines department.

The report, tabled in the legislature, said production totalled about 4,300,000 tons, but the man-shifts necessary to produce this dropped by 11 per cent, resulting in an output per man-shift of 2.81 tons. This was three per cent higher than the previous high of 2.73 tons in 1959.
