

Pharmacists Hope To Expand Their Role In Civil Defence

HALIFAX, (CP)—The Canadian Pharmaceutical Association was told Wednesday that Canadian pharmacists are headed for a much expanded role in organized civil defence.

J. Earle Matthews, medical supplies officer of the civil defence branch of the federal health department, said "pharmacists must take their rightful place with medical, dental and nursing profession."

"In early stages of planning," he said, the pharmacists accepted the responsibility of handling medical supplies at all levels. Now we must visualize a much expanded role for the pharmacists in civil defence.

While every pharmacist in Canada could not participate in civil defence planning, Mr. Matthews said it was necessary to have small, well-trained units that could be rapidly expanded in time of disaster.

Within a year it is expected construction work will start on the mining of iron ore at Ungava, Quebec. Cyrus Eaton, Jr., like his famous father, is a financier in the venture. Dr. Krzywicki is the head of the geology department of Germany's Krupp firm. Capt. Petersen is the head of a Danish firm interested in shipping the ore to Germany. At present plans are that most of the ore will be shipped to Germany, 2,000 miles distant, no farther by sea than the nearest U. S. industrial centres.
