

CLOSING of ROADS REGULATIONS

Made under the provisions of Subsection (b) of Section 52 of The Roads Act, 1965.

1. Regulations made under Subsection (c) of Section 51 of The Roads Act, 1965, are hereby repealed.
2. In these Regulations:
 - (a) "Heavy Traffic" means the use of any Road or Highway by any motor vehicle having a gross weight with load, in excess of 8000 pounds.
 - (b) "Pavement" or "Paved Road" means those roads which have been paved or otherwise topped with bituminous asphalt or concrete.
 - (c) "Publication" means publication in a newspaper published in the province.
 - (d) "Public Notice" means notice given to the public by or on behalf of the Minister, either by publication, or by radio or television announcement, to the effect that all or certain roads, as specified, are closed to heavy traffic, or to all traffic, or that such roads as may have previously been indicated as being closed, are now open, and such public notice may be given on Sunday or on a holiday.
 - (e) "Traffic" means the use of any Road or Highway by motor vehicles.
3. Upon giving of public notice, all paved roads, or such as may be specified in such notice, shall be closed to heavy traffic, or to all traffic, as the case may be, and shall remain closed from midnight on the day upon which such public notice is given, or stated effective, until public notice shall have been given removing such closure.
4. It shall be an offence against these Regulations for any person to operate a motor vehicle, or a motor vehicle of the type prohibited, over or upon such roads as may have been declared to be closed pursuant to such public notice.
5. Peace Officers, as defined in Section 2 (f) of The Roads Act, 1965, are hereby empowered to enforce these Regulations.
6. In any prosecution for an offence against these Regulations the production of:
 - (a) a copy of a newspaper containing a public notice, or
 - (b) an affidavit of the Manager or person in charge of a radio or television broadcasting station, stating that public notice has been given over such station, the date of such public notice, and the words used therein,
 shall be conclusive evidence that such public notice was given, the contents of such public notice, and the date and fact of such public notice.

DENVER MOTHER AND SON AT ODDS OVER CALLUP

DENVER, Colo. (AP) - A mother who doesn't want her U.S. Army to take her son before Christmas looked wistfully at him here. "He's so angry with me he won't speak to me," Mrs. Norma Riedel murmured. The son, Robert Schnabel, 19, seemed embarrassed and annoyed by his mother's action in sending telegrams of protest to President Johnson and 5th Army Headquarters at Chicago. She sent the telegram Wednesday after Schnabel had been told to report for induction Dec. 23. Mother and son were together Thursday at restaurant and bar Mrs. Riedel and her mother operate near the edge of downtown Denver. "I never dreamed what I did would lead to all this," Mrs. Riedel said as she gazed at the knot of reporters and photographers massed in the place. **HANDS SHOOK** Her hands shook nervously as she rearranged glasses and straightened an already smooth table cloth. "We knew it was coming and I have been checking the mail every day," she said. "But this is unfair. Two or three days won't make that much difference in Viet Nam." She said, her telegrams read: "One of America's mothers would like to know if our war position is so crucial that we have to draft our sons during Holy Week or are we taking the Christ out of Christmas?" Young Schnabel said he is ready to go whenever he is called. "I could go into the national guard," he said. "But I'd rather put in this hitch and get it over with." He flung one arm around his mother's shoulders as reporters watched, although he didn't appear to say anything. A spokesman at 5th Army Headquarters said a reply to Mrs. Riedel's telegram will be made. There was no immediate comment from the White House.

Nazi Leader Martin Bormann Reported To Be Still Alive

FRANKFURT (Reuters) - A West German official said here that Nazi leader Martin Bormann, missing since 1944, is alive, according to the son of the executed Nazi Adolf Eichmann. Fritz Bauer, public prosecutor charged with investigating Bormann's fate, said in an interview published in the newspaper Frankfurter Rundschau that Eichmann's son Horst claimed in 1961 to be acting as a go-between for Bormann. Bormann is the last major Nazi leader still missing. He is under sentence of death on war crimes charges. In 1944, Adolf Hitler named Bormann, then titular head of the Nazi party, as his successor. Since then Bormann has been rumored to be alive in various out-of-the-way locations, among them Paraguay and the Mato Grosso jungle of Brazil. The most recent rumors circulated here had him in Paraguay. **CAPTURE SAID EASY** An Israeli who had a key role in the discovery of Eichmann in Argentina said in October that Bormann was also in the Argentine, and could be taken overnight for a \$50,000 reward. The reward offered by West German authorities is 100,000 marks (\$27,500). Bauer told the Frankfurter Rundschau that Horst Eichmann, a sailor, wrote to the Frankfurt chief judge in 1961 "on behalf of Herr Martin Bormann, who intends to present himself to an international court after the end of the trial of my father, SS Lt.-Col. Adolf Eichmann, in order to reveal to the world the only and final truth about the Jewish question from 1939 to 1945." Bauer said his staff immediately located Horst Eichmann, who told them "I have had several conversations with Bormann lasting about half an hour - some of them recently." **MAY DELIVER HIM** The newspaper also said it had reports from Bonn that the senior high court judge in Buenos Aires, Boff Boggero, has been negotiating with the West German government to hand over Bormann. No confirmation was immediately available in Bonn. The paper's Bonn correspondent wrote that Boggero, during a visit to Bonn a few weeks ago, negotiated over the extradition of Eichmann and also of Düsseldorf lawyer Gerhard Bohne, 59, who is accused of taking part in Hitler's euthanasia (mercy killing) program and is under arrest in Argentina.

Third Man Is Charged In Car Ring

MONTREAL (CP) - A third man has been charged with conspiracy in connection with an alleged stolen-car ring which police reported they uncovered last Sunday in nearby Brossard on the south shore of the St. Lawrence. Ernest Jubeau, 34, of suburban Ville Lemoyne has been arraigned, charged with conspiracy to steal cars valued at \$300,000 and conspiracy to be in possession of stolen cars. Jubeau, whose occupation was listed as scrapyard manager, was ordered to preliminary hearing next Thursday. He pleaded not guilty to both charges. In the raids last Sunday 30 suspects were arrested by Quebec and Ontario Provincial Police. Six of the original suspects were later released and another man was arrested Monday. **175 CARS STOLEN** After the raids, QPP Director J. A. Robert said the car ring was "the largest in Quebec history." There were indications of 175 cars having been stolen. The arraignment of Jubeau came 24 hours after Benoit Brassard, 28, and Mario Santamo, 30, had been arraigned on similar charges. Meanwhile, police reported they have broken up a gang of young hoodlums who carried out thefts with an eye for flash and speed in sports cars and souped-up stock models. This operation was distinct from that of the big car-theft ring. "They are young punks and were doing it for their own fun," said a police officer. Four young men in their early 20s were detained after raids in nearby Greenfield Park and at a summer camp at Bromo Lake, 65 miles south east of Montreal.

India Decides To Ration Food

NEW DELHI (Reuters) - India has decided on sweeping emergency measures, including rationing, to meet the threat of famine caused by the country's worst drought of the century. But the main hope of meeting the crisis, some observers feel, lies in stepping up imports of United States wheat, already reaching India at the rate of 20,000 tons a day. Eight of the country's 16 states have been hit, and in Rajasthan alone 5,000,000 people are affected. Hundreds of peasants and their families were reported on the move from the state's drought-hit areas. Rationing of wheat, rice and sugar will start in major cities soon. **REVIVES WHIPPING** BRIDGETOWN (Reuters) Barbados has revived whipping with a cat o' nine tails as punishment for certain criminal offences. The House of Assembly Tuesday night unanimously agreed to allow such whipping for 15 serious offences. Crimes of violence have increased in recent years. **12 SOLDIERS KILLED** RAWALPINDI (AP) - Twelve more Indian soldiers have been killed in four clashes on the ceasefire line, a Pakistan government spokesman said Wednesday. Pakistani forces suffered two casualties, he said.

Football Star Sentenced To Electric Chair

LINCOLN, Neb. (AP) - A U.S. federal court jury has ordered Duane E. Pope, a college football star turned killer, to pay with his life for a bloody Big Springs, Neb., bank robbery six months ago. Judge Robert Van Pelt, ordered the death sentence executed in the electric chair March 3, 1966 at 11:30 a.m. Spurred by the 10 men and two women was a defence contention that the mid-mannered 22-year-old Roxbury, Kan. farm youth was insane when he shot four bank employees in the back and neck, killing three, as they lay face down on the bank floor. The states affected by the drought are Mysore, Maharashtra, Orissa, Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, Punjab and Uttar Pradesh.

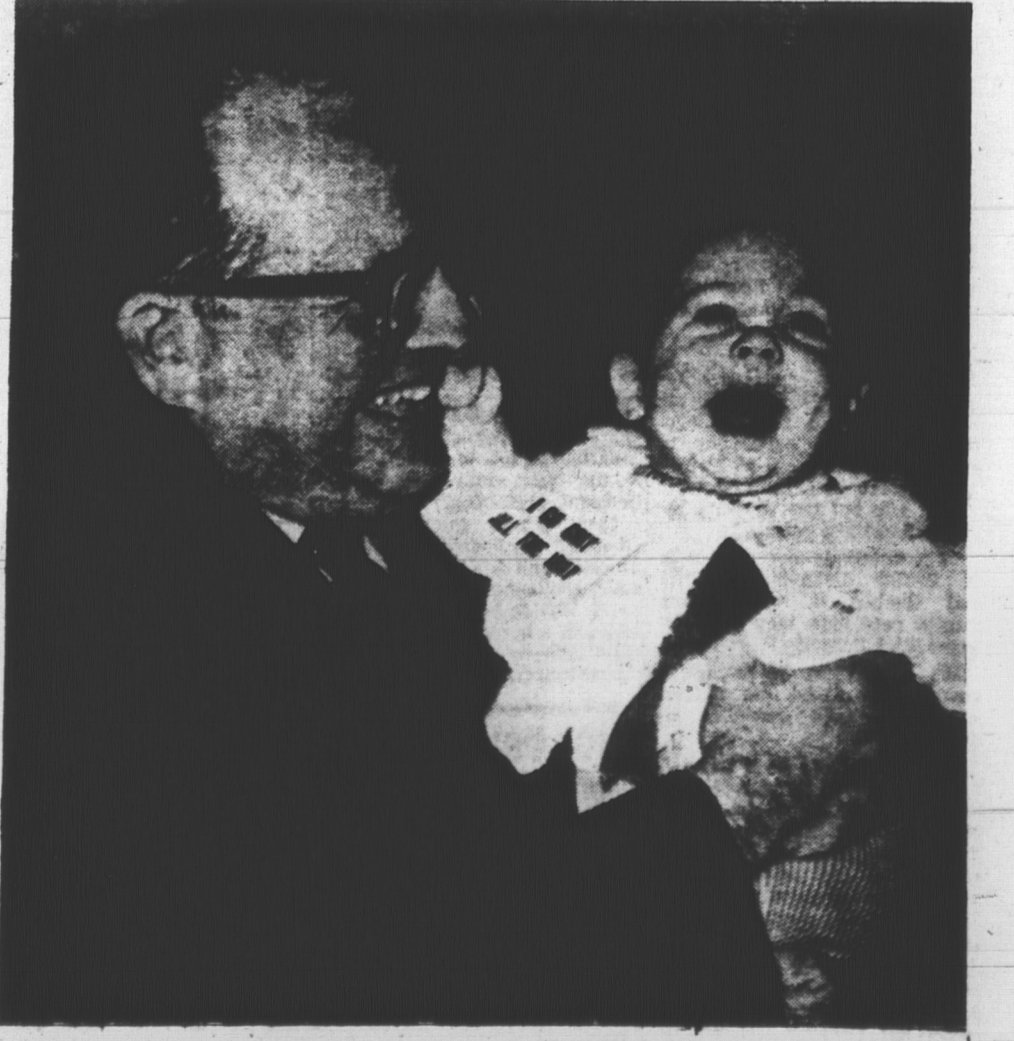
