Within a fortnight withdrawals have reduced the stock of gold in the United States Treasury from \$112,000,000 to \$101,000,000, and there are outstanding some \$450,000,000 of notes which the Government is pledged to redeem with gold on presentation. The chance is that within a few days, in spite of the receipt of the proceeds of the late fifty million loan, the gold reserve will again fall below the hundred million safety mark.
