

The Transvaal War

The latest reports from Mafeking are more hopeful. Correspondents at Mafeking send reports up to March 16. One says that the problem of feeding the natives within the British lines has been satisfactorily solved. Another writes that the soup kitchens are a great success. Men are appointed to inspect the food. The natives take the soup readily. Everybody will be glad, for the sake of the white children, when the siege is raised.

Supplies are being received, but there is a shortage of oatmeal, flour, milk and sugar. Plenty of oats being ground, but there is no apparatus for properly cleaning them. There is no indication from what source the supplies mentioned are being received, but the statement is welcomed, as indicating the ability of the garrison to hold out for a considerable time longer.

The remainder of the news from Mafeking mainly repeats incidents that have been made familiar by previous reports. Nothing more has been heard from Col. Plumer, except a brief official statement from Pretoria, that he retreated northward with an armored train. This apparently refers to his withdrawal from Lobatsi.

The war in South Africa has brought about a leather famine in England, owing to the great demands of the Government for saddlery and harness. The authorities at Pall Mall have, it is stated, expended £1,000,000 in leather articles since Mr. Kruger issued his ultimatum. Prices have advanced by leaps and bounds, and now stand at almost prohibitive rates.

Lord Roberts has given permission to the Bank of Africa and the National Bank of the Free State to continue their business at Bloemfontein subject to certain restrictions. The banks are allowed to cash cheques and drafts of paymasters and officers in Cape Town and London, and transmit the money of the general public to Natal, Cape Colony, and Europe. Transactions are not permitted with towns in the Transvaal or the Free State still occupied by the enemy.

MASERU, Basutoland, March 31.—Mr. Steyn is reported to have gone to Ladybrand to stir up the burghers there to renewed resistance. The Boers have removed from the immediate vicinity of Plattberg and taken up a commanding position adjacent. The Dutch who surrendered their arms at Ladybrand are now suffering seizures of their live stock.

Jamaica Disappointed.

CHICAGO, March 31.—The Record publishes a despatch from Kingston, Jamaica, stating that the budget which the Hon. W. S. Fielding, Canadian Minister of Finance, has presented to the Dominion Parliament has produced great disappointment there. Jamaicans had hoped for further and concessions which should encourage trade between the West Indies and Canada, diverting the trade of the islands from the United States. Trinidad alone, however, benefits by the budget, and Jamaica now is forced to place its main reliance for a prosperous future on the ratification of the reciprocity treaty by the United States Senate.
