Education Week At Stella Maris

Monday afternoon the High School Students heard Mrs. M. J. Doyle speak to them on Teacher Recruitment in a very interesting talk. Mrs. Doyle explained to the student body the great need of good teachers in our schools, and the part they could play in filling the ranks. She told them how privileged they were to attend this fine well-equipped school taught by efficient teachers, and how happy they should be to pass on to others what they were receiving. This address was sponsored by the Home and School Association, as a special feature of Education Week.

Symptoms

These depend upon the age of the bird attacked, the species of coccidia infecting the bird, the number of infective parasites ingested, and the susceptibility of the bird. The disease seldom occurs in chicks under eight weeks of age. Most of the worst outbreaks occur when the birds are four to eight weeks old. Bloody droppings are seen when the chicks are affected with the cecal type of the disease, and to a lesser extent in other types. Chicks badly affected with either of these types, die very soon after symptoms are first noticed and quite frequently the mortality rate is high.

It is important to have an accurate diagnosis made. This cannot be done without making a microscopic examination of the cecal and intestinal contents.

Due to the fact that the parasites are exceptionally resistant to most of the common disinfectants it is extremely difficult, if not impossible, to completely free the poultry house of all parasites when cleaning and disinfecting. Usually serious outbreaks with consequent high mortality, can be prevented if the quarters are kept dry.

Various methods of treatment with drugs have been tried and several of these have proven successful. If any one has found that a certain treatment has prevented serious losses year after year, I would not suggest that he change to some other form of medication. Some of the drugs used are sulfa-methazine, sulfasuxidine and sulfaguanidine have been used extensively and found of definite value in the treatment of flocks affected with Coccidiosis. One that can be administered in the drinking water is preferred to one that is mixed in the mash. Sick chickens or poulters will drink when they will not eat.

No hard and fast rules can be laid down regarding the number of days a flock should be treated with Sulfa drugs, and it is advisable before commencing treatment, to discuss the situation with some who thoroughly understands their use.

The birds should not be flushed at any time while they are being treated with Sulfa drugs. If the drug is administered in the drinking water, no other liquid should be given to the birds while they are receiving the treatment.

The Veterinary Diagnostic Laboratory is located in the Health Centre, Charlottetown, and is in a position to make a diagnosis of your flock condition. This service is free of charge to all livestock and poultry owners in Prince Edward Island.
