Like research has proposed in Toronto and several firms have agreed to build laboratories here in association with the Ontario Research Association.

A similar centre at the University of British Columbia is being set up.

He stressed that these centres will be likely to attract high-calibre scientists on a long-term basis.

"This is definitely a coming trend," he said. "The new developments that will revolutionize technology will likely flow from centres of this kind."

Dr. Theimer said Canada lags very very behind the United States in industrial research. Research by private corporations in Canada was much less than it should be.

For years the government did most of the research for industry, but now industry is itself becoming research-minded.

"I think that now the government should concentrate on grants, fellowships and things like that and let industry carry the ball itself."

Won't Join Pros Till After Dec. Says Rod Laver

FOREST HILLS, N.Y. (AP)—Rod Laver said Monday he will not join the professional tennis tour until after the Davis Cup challenge round in December.

"That's definite," the 24-year-old rocket from Australia said after winning the U.S. tennis championship. "After the challenge round I'll sit down and do some thinking and talk it over with my employer."

Laver won the title with a 6-4, 6-7, 6-4 victory over his Davis Cup teammate, Roy Emerson, to complete the coveted grand slam and become the hottest property in tennis.

Of all the great players of the past, only Don Budge won all four 1911 championships—Australian, French, Wimbledon and United States—in one year before Laver came along. Budge did it in 1932.

Now the pros are after Laver and the word is that his asking price is \$150,000. Whether he'll get it remains to be seen. But he won't settle for less than \$75,000.

ROYAL BANK APPOINTMENT

Solution Sought On Controversy In Asian Games

BELGRADE (AP)—Dr. Kinichi Asano of Japan said Monday he will seek a solution of the Asian games controversy that threatens one-third of the world's leading athletes and officials with disqualification.

"We have been giving this matter close study and we hope it will all be settled here in Belgrade," said Dr. Asano, vice president of the Japanese Amateur Athletic Federation.

"We would like to avoid anything happening here which would jeopardize Japan's standing in the 1964 Olympics."

Asano is heading the Japanese delegation to the 22nd congress of the International Amateur Athletic Federation which will hold plenary sessions here early next week.

The IAAF last month withdrew recognition of the Asian games in Jakarta after Indonesia refused entry permits for
