In the steel Canadian Iron Foundries was up 1 at 35 1/4, Ontario advanced 1/4 at 26 and Stelco gained 1/4 at 68 1/2.

The refining and pipelines oils were up in a narrow range.

The banks were generally lower with Nova Scotia off 2 at 65 1/2 and Commerce down 1/4 at 54 1/2. Both were trading ex-dividend.

Up 1/2 in the papers were International at 11 1/2 and Price Bros. at 44 1/2. Bowater gained 1/2 at 6, Howard Smith advanced 1/2 at 40 1/2 and Powell River lost 1/2 at 37.

The utilities were mixed. Jamaica lost 1/2 at 23. Calgary was up 1/2 at 70 1/2 and Power Corp. gained 1/2 at 62.

The base metals Noranda gained 1/2 at 52 and Asbestos lost 1/4 at 34 1/2.

Up 1/2 in the construction issues were Canada Cement at 34 1/2 and Dominion Bridge at 21 1/2.

Dominion stores gained 2 at 84, a new high.

The mines and oils were irregularly higher.
