## Island Odds And Ends

Members of the Canadian Legion and old war comrades will be glad to know that "Larry Trainor", Inspector of Weights and Measures who has been ill in the Charlottetown Hospital for several months, is recovering and should soon be able to attend to his official duties.

In the First World War, Larry held the job of Sergeant-Major with Colonel D. A. MacKinnon's 36th Battery, although he was later transferred to a Brigade post in the same capacity. To put it mildly Sergeant-Majors are not very popular with the rank and file, mainly because they must set a standard for discipline, and enforce all military regulations to the full. It is not an enviable job and few men who ever held it, were able at the same time to hold the good-will of the men in the ranks.

Larry Trainor was an exception, because though he was a disciplinarian to his finger tips, he had tact, and a sense of humour, which somehow took the edge off the unpleasant commands which was his duty to issue from time to time.

Military regulations demanded that he be addressed as Sergeant-Major, but he always remained "Larry" to the boys in off-duty hours. Before the war, for a time, he was in Canadian regular army, and his erect military bearing still stamps him as a soldier of the old school. He has marshalled many Armistice Day parades of the Legion, and at such times the Sergeant-Major stands out all over him. When he calls a parade to attention on Armistice Day, he is all soldier, and any slackness in the ranks still annoys him.

His present illness is a recurrence of one that sent him to hospital during the war, and he was desperately ill on that occasion. Old soldiers through the province who know him, and there are many of them from East Point to Tignish, will rejoice that he is convalescent. There is something in the old song after all "Old Soldiers Never Die, They Simply Fade Away."

Montague has never lacked enterprise, and the town reflects in its well-designed homes, and stores and its atmosphere of well-being, the spirit of the community.

A few weeks ago, the town's Masonic Temple was almost completely destroyed by fire. The upper floor only was used as lodge room, the lower part housed three of four offices. Insurance covered only part of the loss and the blow was a heavy one. But little time was wasted over lamentation. Many citizens volunteered to work gratis, others who were less "well fixed" accepted half pay, lumber was purchased at a very low price from friendly well-wishers, and reconstruction began with enthusiasm.

Today the damaged building is no longer a wreck and the interior will soon be ready for skilled "firish" carpenters to take over. Not only are the ravages of fire being made good, but the reconstructed edifice will be more attractive, more modern, better laid-out than before. Thus out of calamity Montague with co-operation and unselfishness turned loss into gain.

Mr. R. K. Clements has been the driving spirit behind the actual work but with plenty of helpers to supplement his well-planned operations. Montague will know when the building has been completed, because a loud speaker system is being installed by the Masonic Lodge with the speaker at roof top level. Important town announcements will be made when necessary and will be heard all over the community. It is believed the loud speaker system will serve many purposes, not the least important of which will be to that of a fire alarm.

Some people like old books, old songs, old furniture, some like anything that is old including old landmarks. Mr. Thomas Morris, whose son heads the Morris Ginterale Company, knows much about the older buildings in Charlottetown. The building which was the first hotel in the city, is located on the south side of the Gaol Square, according to Mr. Morris. Since it's palmy days as a hotel it has been remodelled somewhat and is now used as a dwelling house.

In the days when that end of the city, including the Esplanade and the present site of the City Hospital, was a military compound used by an Imperial Garrison, the old hotel was quite a centre. It was frequented by all the big-wigs in the colony and officers of the garrison. Many a toast was drunk there and many a wager made when the men of His Majesty's forces foregathered for an evening's relaxation.

Remember the big days in hockey back in the "Thirties" when Charlottetown had a team in the "Big Four" and that League won the Allan Cup and the championship of Canada, three years in a row?

If you do, you will also remember Harold "Husky" Gross the 100-pound defenceman from Kitchener, Ontario, who played such a sound game back of the blue-line, and whose shrill voice could always be heard directing and encouraging his team-mates.

"Husky" it has just become known in Charlottetown passed away at his home in Ontario just after Christmas. An infection, said to have been blood-poisoning developed in his leg and following amputation he failed to recover. Many outsiders wore Abegweit colors in "Big Four" days and "Husky" was regarded by the fans as one of the most honest, dependable, to come to the City.

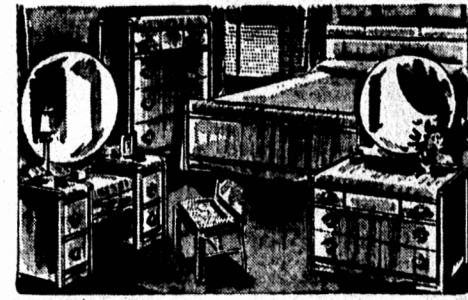

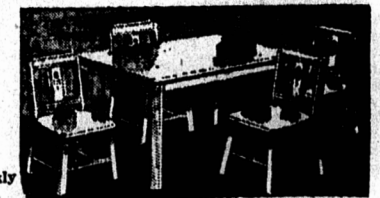
