Livestock

MONTREAL, July 18 (CP)—Receipts on the Montreal market today were 163 cattle, 13 sheep and lambs, 1,118 hogs and 653 calves. Calves were steady to strong. Other classes unchanged. The cattle offered were mostly cows and bulls. There were no top steers. The few steers brought \$5 to \$8. Good cows sold up to \$5, with medium kinds \$4.25 to \$4.75 and common butchers from \$3.25 to \$4. Canners and cullifers were \$2.50 to \$3. Good bulls \$4.75 to \$5.25 and commoner bulls from \$3 to \$4.50. Medium good to good veals brought \$7 to \$7.50 with an odd top at \$8. Fair to medium veals were \$6 to \$6.50 and common light kinds down to \$5. Grassers and common drinker were \$4 to \$4.75, mostly \$4 to \$4.25. Good ewes and wethers made \$10 with \$1 per cwt. cut on bucks and \$2 per cwt. cut on culls. Several small lots were sold \$9 to \$9.50 flat. Sheep were \$3 to \$4. Bacon hogs were \$9.75 fed and watered and \$10 off trucks. Sells were \$1 per hog premium with the usual cuts on off grades. Sows were \$5.25 to \$6.25. Hogs sold on rail grade brought \$13.35 cold weight.

GRAIN

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WINNIPEG, July 18 (CP)—Minor seaboard buying, scattered short-covering and light offerings lifted wheat futures prices back from early losses on Winnipeg grain exchange today and held values steady in the last half of the session. Quotations closed 3-8-1-2 cent higher, with July at 54 3-8, October 54 1-2-5-8, November 56 1-8 and December 56 1-4 cents. At Liverpool, values fell 7-8-3-4. Buenos Aires remained unchanged.

CROP REPORT

OTTAWA, July 18 (CP)—Crops in the Prairie Provinces suffered a setback from a week of hot dry weather, the Dominion Bureau of Statistics said today in a report covering crop conditions in Canada. High temperatures were reported from many points in the Prairies and crops drew heavily on moisture reserves. Reports of yellowing and tipping in early wheat were received from the southern part of the wheat belt.

Crop conditions in Eastern Canada have been well maintained during the past two weeks, the report said. Improvement in the Maritime provinces has continued, and although the hay crop is 1-1/2 to 2-1/2 weeks behind, spring grains, potatoes and roots have made good progress.

MONTREAL, July 18—The first British Trans-Atlantic air mail service will begin on August 5 according to a cable received today from the Imperial Airways by Trans-Canada air lines here. The Empire flying boats Cabot and Caribou will be used on a regular weekly schedule. It is expected that the inaugural flight will be made by the Cabot piloted by Capt. J. C. Kelly Rogers.
