

CURRENT NOTES.

It is reckoned that the daily sale of natural flowers in Paris realizes about \$20,000. The flowers most in fashion at present are the gardenia, which sells at five francs each flower; the lily of the valley, worth ten francs the pot; the queen rose and the purple rose, the Spanish carnation and the violet. The camellia, at one time so much prized, is now quite out of fashion.
