Bank Officer Is Appointed

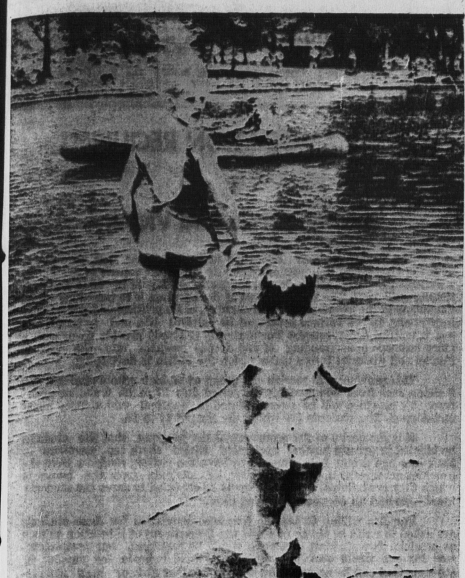
OTTAWA (CP)—Dr. William C. Hood, 43, of Toronto has been appointed a senior officer of the Bank of Canada with the title of adviser, bank Governor Louis Rasmussen announced Monday. Dr. Hood, a native of Yarmouth, N.S., has been at the University of Toronto since 1946—since 1959 as professor of economics. He was research director and economic adviser for the royal commission on banking finance in 1961-63 and assistant research director for the royal commission on Canada's economic prospects in 1955-56. Shoe Firms See Troubles In Duty Cuts

OTTAWA (CP)—Canadian shoe manufacturers warned Monday that reductions in the present custom duty rates against foreign-made footwear would compound the industry's problems of some and do nothing for it abroad. In a brief to the Canadian Tariffs and Trade Committee, the Shoe Manufacturers' Association of Canada called on the federal government to seek to maintain these rates during the current Kennedy round of tariff negotiations. H. J. Tebbutt of Montreal, president of the association, said in the brief that "any re-

duction in duty rates would merely deliver a larger segment of the domestic footwear market to workers abroad with concurrent loss in tax revenues and employment in this country." More than 75 communities in Canada contained footwear fac-

South Viet Nam Can Represent Last Stand Of U.S. in S-E Asia

By WILLIAM L. RYAN Associated Press Staff Writer South Viet Nam today may represent the last stand of the United States in Southeast Asia. The drama of conflict between the West and the Orient in Indochina is a century old, and the way the United States handles the nightmare it inherited there can decide the fate of the whole area. If the Americans are forced from the Asian mainland by a full-scale settlement, or a Communist-leaning prince named Sou Phakouang. GENEVA CONFERENCE Cambodia, the other of the three associated states, was trickier. Communists, occupied with objectives in Laos and Viet Nam, had not invaded Cambodia. Dien Bien Phu fell in May, 1954, and the West was shaken. A Geneva conference divided Viet Nam at the 17th parallel. Ho Chi Minh sealed off the north. But large pockets of Viet Minh clung to territory they held in the south and bided their time. To former Emperor Bao Dai, a reputed playboy, fell the task of ruling the south. For help he turned to a brilliant nationalist, one a deadly foe of both the French and the Communists. Ngo Dinh Diem became premier before long by means of a managed referendum, but he was able to proclaim a republic of South Viet Nam and oust Bao Dai. Diem became president. Diem performed miracles. He cleaned up the warring sects, he purged his own army of officer opportunists. He brought a semblance of sanity to the country. But he avoided the 1956 elections called for by the Geneva accords. Vice-Admiral H. S. Rayner To Retire

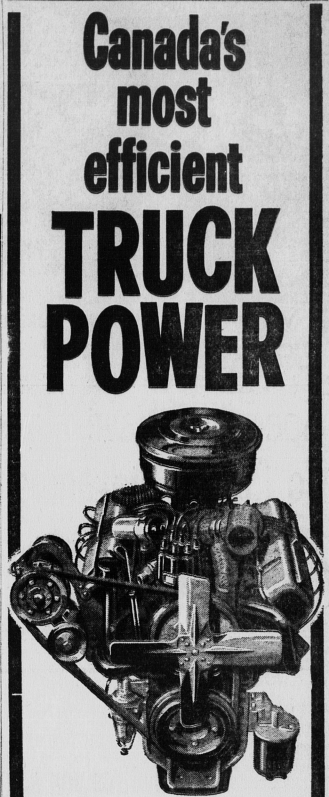
OTTAWA (CP)—Vice-Admiral Herbert S. Rayner, DSC and bar, 53, will retire from the navy in July on completion of a four-year term as chief of naval staff, the defence department announced Monday. He will not be replaced because the defence headquarters command structure is being unified and the position of chief of naval staff will disappear. Admiral Rayner, a native of Clinton, Ont., has served nearly 36 years in the RCN. During the Second World War he commanded destroyers in the Battle of the Atlantic, on the convoy route to North Russia and in the English Channel and the Bay of Biscay. One of his ships was the destroyer Hurler which, in a period of less than three months, fought in a series of actions in which five enemy warships were destroyed and two damaged. He was the first commandant of Royal Roads, Esquimalt, B.C., when it was made a tri-service college; the first co-ordinator of the joint staff at defence headquarters; and the first Canadian maritime commander Pacific when RCN and RCAF units on the West Coast were integrated into a single maritime force in 1959.

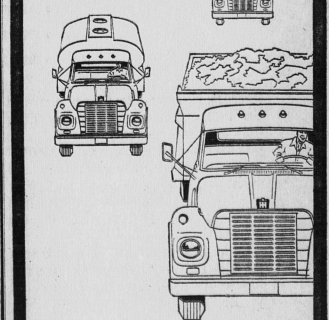
