

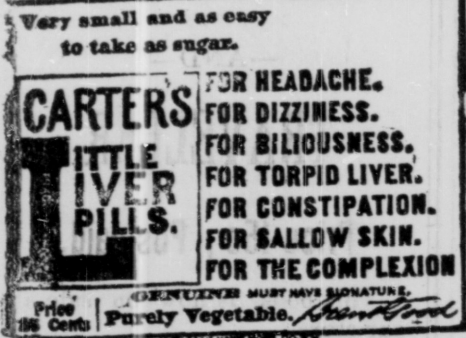

Washington Post: A young English man who left town a fortnight ago to return to his native land after six months' visit to America took time before he went away to tell me about some of the extraordinary things he had learned on his travels, and, now that he is on the high seas, where he can't possibly read this, I am free to repeat to you a most important and singular fact he imparted to me concerning Lake Superior. A very learned man told it to him in Duluth. Here's what the Englishman told me the wise man told him: "You know the water in Lake Superior is intensely cold," said he, "it's a most extraordinary thing, too for it is many degrees colder than the water in the other of the great lakes. It was most interesting to me to learn of the curious American custom that causes it. In winter, I was informed by a gentleman in Duluth, the ice freezes on Lake Superior to a depth of 20 or 25 feet fancy and the harvesting of the ice crop, he assured me, is the chief industry of the laboring classes. The ice is cut into immense blocks, that are so large it would be difficult to lift them from the water; so, in order to preserve them, they are weighted with shot, attached by ropes to buoys, and sunk to the bottom of the lake. A most ingenious idea, isn't it? When they are needed they are floated to the service, towed ashore, and cut up. The whole bottom of the lake is quite paved with ice blocks, I am told. It's a most extraordinary thing, but one can't help seeing that that's why the water is so very cold. It's really a lake of iced water you know. I shall tell them at home that you Americans are so fond of iced water that you keep a whole lake of it in the States. Curious idea, isn't it? But so cleverly American you know!"

Our Trade With Great Britain.

The British Board of Trade returns issued recently for the seven months of the present year ending July 31, show the following increases in imports from Canada during that period: Cattle, £40,000; wheat, £341,000; oats, £267,000; bacon, £282,000; hams, £80,000; cheese, £400,000; eggs, £7,000; fish £182,000. The decreases in imports are: Sheep, £9,000; wheat flour, £141,000; maize, £204,000; butter, £81,000; hewn wood, £24,000; sawn wood, £190,000. The increases in British exports to Canada are: Salt, £14,000; spirits, £17,000; wool, £17,000; cotton piece goods, £107,000; jute piece goods, £12,000; linen piece goods, £20,000; woollen tissues, £102,000; worsted tissues, £51,000; carpets, £46,000; pig iron, £24,000; tin plates, £58,000; unwrought steel, £175,000; apparel and slops, £35,000; cements, £18,000; seed oil, £30,000. Railway iron decreased £18,000.

Fish Fell From the Sky.

John S Fogg, a cattle man and farmer, brought a dozen small fish to the city today and told in an interesting manner of finding them floundering about on the hot dry prairie at noon, having apparently fallen from the sky. A black cloud appeared hiding the sun, and several bright flashes of lightning came from the cloud, after which the fish were seen glistening and lively, evidently much disconcerted by their surroundings. They are small specimens of the perch family, and Mr Fogg's idea that they fell from the clouds is fully believed by men of experience. Mr H E Ambold says it is an uncommon thing for a fish to fall out of a passing cloud.—Galveston (Tex) News.

King of Servia Weds.

BELGRADE, Aug 8.—King Alexander yesterday wedded Mme. Draga Maschin, the ceremony being performed with great pomp. In honor of the event the King granted an amnesty, together with numerous political pardons, including the former Radical Premier Tauschanovich. Mme. Draga Maschin was a waiting lady on the count, and there was some opposition to the match.

Russian Hordes.

LONDON, Wednesday, Aug. 9.—The Daily Graphic's Sebastopol correspondent claims to have the best military authority for stating that Russia proposes, in addition to the troops already despatched from Odessa to the far East, to embark 125,000 men at that port before the end of the year.

Arms for China.

LONDON, Aug. 8.—An order for thirty million rounds of small arms ammunition is being filled at the Woolwich arsenal for shipment to China. It is stated that the ammunition makers throughout the country have also been ordered to furnish all they can.
