JAMES PURDY IRVING
On May 17th, 1955, there passed peacefully away at his home in Cherry Valley, after three years of declining health, James Purdy, son of the late William W. Irving and his wife Isabelle Irving of Murray Harbour North. Born May 1st, 1867, he lived all his life on the homestead which he loved, as well as his neighbors and friends. Atlantic Fisheries Show Increases During April

OTTAWA (CP)—Atlantic fisheries flourished during April resulting in greater landings worth more money than a year ago. The bureau of statistics reported today that the Atlantic catch rose to 79,356,000 pounds worth \$3,484,000 from 68,510,000 worth \$3,126,000 a year ago.

Newfoundland fishermen landed 20,182,000 pounds of fish in March, up slightly from 20,209,000 a year earlier. The value rose to \$572,000 from \$550,000. Four-month figures followed the same trend with landings up to 61,224,000 pounds from \$4,451,000 and the value of \$1,574,000 from \$1,394,000.

Landings in Nova Scotia in April rose to 34,668,000 pounds from 27,079,000 a year ago and the value rose to \$2,720,000 from \$2,415,000. This brought four-month landings to 9,811,000 pounds against \$4,031,000 and the value of \$6,109,000 versus \$5,869,000.

CATCH DOWN, VALUE UP
New Brunswick catch in April dropped to 3,771,000 pounds from 5,502,000 a year ago but the value was moderately higher at \$494,000 versus \$522,000. The January-April catch fell to 9,974,000 pounds from 11,182,000 but the value moved up to \$615,000 from \$439,000.

Landings in Prince Edward Island declined to 1,100,000 pounds from 1,902,000 and the value to \$100,000 from \$21,000. In the four months the catch rose to 3,219,000 pounds from 2,320,000 and the value to \$60,000 from \$40,000.

Quebec landings rose in April to 19,655,000 pounds from 11,818,000 and the value to \$977,000 from \$68,000. This raised four-month landings to 20,195,000 pounds from 12,047,000 and the value to \$152,000 from \$96,000.
