Plan Social Work Conference For Charlottetown Next Year

The next biennial convention of the Maritime Conference on Social Work will be held in Prince Edward Island in June, 1959. The announcement was made by Eugene MacDonald, the new president of the Conference, following an executive meeting, that the Convention will be held in Charlottetown sometime during the last two weeks of June next year.

The president indicated that the treasurer, J. Gordon MacDonald, has begun preparations for financing the conference and that preparatory steps have begun to provide publicity. These committees are headed by: Frank MacDonald, accommodations; J. Frank O'Neill, Arsenault, registration; Gerald Purdy, and John Miller, publicity; and Walter Baker, program.

Mr. MacDonald also pointed out that this is the only regional social work conference of its kind held in Canada. The last conference was very successfully held in St. John's, Newfoundland in June, 1957. This will be the second time P. E. I. has been host to the conference. The previous island conference was held at Dalvey in 1949.

Hees Is Shown Sample Of Latest Cable

MONTREAL (CP) — A sample of the latest type of transatlantic cable was shown to Transport Minister Hees during a tour of the head offices here of the Crown-owned Canadian Overseas Telecommunication Corporation.

The cable is the type that will be laid between Scotland and Canada in 1961. It is an advanced type over the cable laid in 1956 between Britain, Canada and the United States.

Douglas F. Bowie, president of COTC, accompanied Mr. Hees through the corporation's new building. Mr. Bowie, who leaves for Britain next week to discuss the laying of the new cable with British authorities, said the cable is only one-fifth the weight of the 1956 cable and about two-thirds its size but it will do more.

It will carry 60 telephone circuits compared to 36 in the 1956 cable. Each telephone circuit could be converted into 48 telegraph circuits.

The 1956 cable was laid at a total cost of \$40,000,000 to Britain, Canada and the United States. The new cable, to be jointly owned and operated by Britain and Canada, is to cost \$25,000,000.

Heiress Home Without Husband

LONDON (CP) — Canadian heiress Stephanie Stuart sailed for home Wednesday, no longer a ward of Britain's high court but still not married to Lac Frank Korum, the 21-year-old Canadian to whom her parents objected as a prospective bridegroom.

It was her parents, Toronto businessman John Stuart Jr., and Mrs. Nancy Volpe, whose application made the 18-year-old Peterborough, Ont., girl a ward of the court to prevent her marrying Korum.

The divorced parents flew to London to stop the wedding on the grounds that the Chester, England, heiress was not of legal age.

Report Damages Suit Settled

PORTLAND, Me. (AP) — A \$130,000 suit for injuries in a bus crash that killed two persons and injured 30 was settled Thursday as trial neared an end in U.S. district court.

The suit was brought by six Nova Scotia passengers in a Maine Central Transportation Company bus involved in the accident at Nobleboro, Me., in August, 1955.

The bus company wouldn't disclose the amount of settlement. Plaintiffs were Thelma Campbell and Elizabeth Maloney, both of Westville; Ira McGregor and Levi Doucette, both of Glace Bay; Clyde Mann of Halifax, and Adam Campbell of Sydney. Mann had asked \$30,000, the others \$20,000 each.

Their suit was against the Maine Central, James A. Tripp of New Bedford, Mass., driver of the car involved, or both. Maine Central contended Tripp was negligent.

The suit was the last of seven based on the accident asking for a total of \$755,000. All have been settled.

OTTAWA (CP) — Cod from France and the Faeroes are offering serious competition to lower Newfoundland grades for the Italian market, a trade department official reports.

K. F. Osmond, commercial secretary at Rome, writing in the current issue of the department's fortnightly publication, Foreign Trade, advises exporters to pay strict attention to quality if sales and prices are to be maintained.

He said Italians prefer fresh fish but salted cod is in strong demand because of its high protein content and low price.

Their suit was against the Maine Central, James A. Tripp of New Bedford, Mass., driver of the car involved, or both. Maine Central contended Tripp was negligent.

The suit was the last of seven based on the accident asking for a total of \$755,000. All have been settled.
