Senior medical officer on parade will be Surgeon Commander L. E. Prowse. Senior service officers joining the Lieutenant Governor at the Provincial building will include: Commander John N. Kenny, CD, Colonel A.W. Rogers, ED and Group Captain J. E. Creeper, DFC.

Guests of the legislature will include the members of the judiciary and their wives, and the wives of the members. Newly-appointed members will be present.

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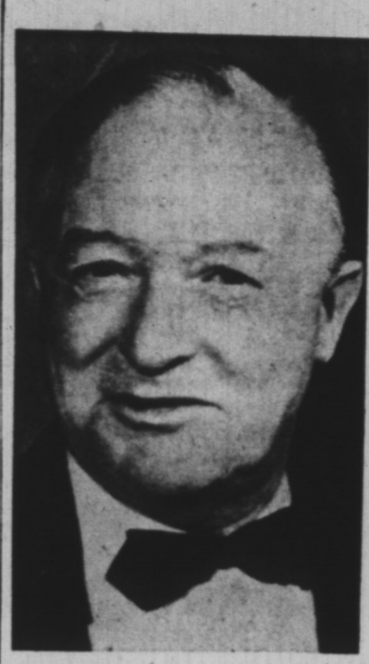

He referred to the government's plan, announced in the throne speech, to give federal-provincial fiscal relations "active co-operative study" by the joint continuing committee on fiscal and economic matters.

At the night sitting, Mr. Fleming said it is difficult to conceive of anything "more hypocritical" than the Liberal party's claims that it stands for consultation with the provinces.

Referring to constitutional amendments in 1946 to change the representation of the provinces in the Commons, Mr. Fleming said the former Liberal government acted without consulting the provinces.

Captain Reported Vessel Was 'On Her Beam Ends'

HALIFAX (CP)—Fears for the safety of 17 Newfoundland fishermen grew Monday as hours passed without word of the St. John's trawler Blue Wave, reported capsizing in an Atlantic gale.

The 60-mile-an-hour wind, whipping up 25-foot waves, already had crippled the Nova Scotia trawler Cape Dauphin, believed to have sunk after her 13-man crew abandoned ship Sunday night.

Four ships searched for the Blue Wave but fog and high seas cut visibility almost to zero. Two rescue planes had to return to Newfoundland when the fog closed in.

Other trawlers and coastal freighters arrived here coated with ice, reporting the worst weather of the winter.

VESSLS ICE-COATED

Several trawlers arrived in Halifax coated with so much ice it took crew members all day to chop it away with axes and sledge - hammers.

Search planes from Torbay and Argentina, Nfld., flew to the Blue Wave's aid but had to suspend the aerial hunt after a few hours when fog reduced visibility.

Tornado, Fog, Ice Hit U.S.

CHICAGO (AP) — A clash of elements spawned a tornado, thunderstorms, dense fog, freezing rains and a sea of ice slick Monday from Colorado to the middle Atlantic coast.

The result was destruction, disruption of air travel, snarled traffic, and a rash of auto accidents which took several lives.

The tornado in southwest Missouri hit Duquesne and another community near Carthage in the afternoon as turbulence developed between a wide sweep of moist southerly winds and the edge of a deep mound of harsh cold air.

Along the Canadian border, temperatures remained below zero in North Dakota, Montana and in northern Maine, after a night of extreme cold. Low temperatures of early morning included 34 degrees below zero at Newport, Vt., and Saranac Lake, N.Y., and 27 below at Bismarck and Grand Forks, N.D.

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\$12,000 HOBBY FOR SALE

City Finds Additional Dentist Is Now Required

Authorization to pay for the services of a second dentist and his assistant and approval for the purchase of new dental equipment for the Charlottetown Dental Clinic was given at the monthly meeting of the City Council here last evening.

Mayor Edwin C. Johnstone presided and all councillors were present except William Boyles who is out of the province and Elmer MacRae who is in hospital.

The resolution authorizing the increased dental services read as follows:

WHEREAS — The Charlottetown Dental Clinic serves less than half the number of needy school children and whereas — The Provincial Government pays the present professional charges serving this group. Be it resolved — That the City Council approve the following recommendations submitted by the Welfare Committee:

That the sum of \$1,400 be authorized to pay for the professional services of a second dentist and his assistant in order to double the dental clinical service effective forthwith.

Be it further resolved that the sum of \$1,600 be also approved for the purchase of required new dental equipment.

The matter was brought to the attention of the Council by Councillor E. C. Baker, chairman of the Welfare Committee.

Dulles To Have Operation, Is Given Leave Of Absence

WASHINGTON (AP) — State Secretary Dulles is taking a leave of absence to undergo a hernia operation and to recuperate further from a recent intestinal illness.

A White House announcement Monday night said the leave would be "for a short period." Dulles will enter Walter Reed Army Hospital here today for the operation.

The arrangement was disclosed shortly after the 71-year-old Dulles had conferred with President Eisenhower.

Dulles, who returned only Monday morning from talks in London, Paris and Bonn on the Berlin crisis, told Eisenhower a written communication:

"My doctors advise that I should have an operation for a recently developed hernia; and I have not wholly thrown off the effects of the inflammation of the colon which occurred last December."
