Mrs. Anne Tuplin of Montserrat arrived home during the illness of her father, the late Fred Tuplin of Indian River.

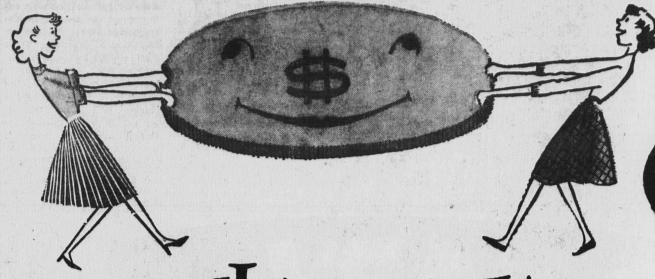
