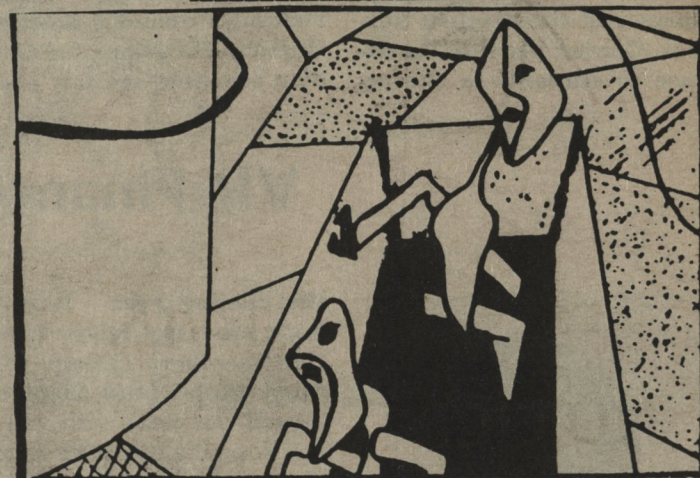
promise to make myself available to you as much as I possibly can.

National Access Awareness Week:

By Participating in scheduled events throughout the week, I attempted to represent student concerns in the area of better accessibility to post-secondary education for disabled students.

Student Aid Presentation:

I researched and presented (with the invaluable help of one Dave Campbell, P.E.I./N.B. CFS Fieldworker) an analysis and proposal for change in our current student loan and bursary program to the Maritime Provinces Higher Education Commission, MPHEC. (The MPHEC is the group who recommends to our premier how much money the government should contribute to our institution and its students.)

Minster of Education Meeting:

The Honourable Betty Jean Brown met with your Student Union Prez, Dean, Dave Campbell, and myself for a lengthy discussion on the position of post-

secondary education in the province. We also did some serious lobbying in the area of student loan and bursary. Things are looking good in this area but we will have to keep the pressure throughout the year to get some much needed and long overdue changes. Graduate School Preparation Program:
