Potato Growers Will Reply To MacRae's Letter

The federation of agriculture potato growers' committee is expected to draft a reply to a letter received from Agriculture Minister Andrew MacRae, which requested further information on the operation and financing of one-day potato selling.

The meeting will be held in the federation offices at 8:30 p.m.

Neither the premier nor the agriculture minister were available for comment on a statement by Leo P. McEague of Mermaid which appeared in yesterday's Guardian.

McEague expressed amazement over what he termed an about-face by the government on the potato plebiscite question. He also claimed the new marketing methods were already being tested and much interest was being shown in them by potato growers in different parts of Canada.
