MONTREAL, Dec. 16 (CP)—Montreal Canadiens Saturday scored their first National League victory since Dec. 1, a 3-1 decision over Boston Bruins.
 The teams go at it again tonight in Boston and the victory gave Canadiens a chance to overhaul the faltering Bruins.
 There was plenty of speed in the rugged, wide-open contest witnessed by 13,750 fans.
 The visitors put on the pressure in the third but smart goaltending on the part of Jerry McNeil, close checking and steady defensive play kept the Bruins from the score sheet.

DETROIT 3, CHICAGO 3
DETROIT, Dec. 16 (AP)—Terry Sawchuk, the National Hockey League's leading goalie, Saturday night registered his sixth shutout of the season as Detroit Red Wings easily beat the last-place Chicago Black Hawks 3-0.
 The first-place Detroiters kept their six-point league lead by scoring twice in the second period and once in the finale.
 Alex Delvecchio sped 120 feet to score the first goal unassisted. Sid Abel made it 2-0 on a close-in deflection of Red Kelly's 30-footer.
 Marty Pavelich added the final flourish by lifting Metro Prystai's rebound into a net with Lumley sprawling to one side.
 Chicago lost forward Bep Guidolin on the first play of the game when he was hit in the face by Gordie Howe's long shot. He was treated for a bruised cheek bone, and sat out the rest of the game.
 With the shutout, four more than any rival goalie, Sawchuk boosted his Vezina Trophy lead to nine goals over Toronto's Al Rollins.

TORONTO, Dec. 16 (CP)—Left wing Sid Smith and centre Ted Kennedy teamed up to give Toronto Maple Leafs the offensive spark for a 4-1 victory over New York Rangers Saturday night in a National Hockey League game before 12,618 fans.
 The swift-skating Smith, an attacking powerhouse all the way, collected his 11th and 12th goals of the season and also had an assist as well. Kennedy got two scoring points with a goal and an assist. Right wing Tod Sloan kept pace with two assists.
 The Rangers, who downed the Leafs 7-2 in New York last Sunday, tried valiantly but couldn't cope with the Toronto attack. Goalie Chuck Rayner's sensational puck-stopping job—he blocked 31 shots—kept them in the game. Al Rollins of Toronto made 16 stops.
