### Federal Gov't Calls Tenders For Breakwater At West Point

OTTAWA, Jan. 15. (Special) — Tenders are being called by the Federal Department of Public Works for construction of a breakwater at West Point, Prince County, and are receivable up to February 10. Estimated cost of the project is \$50,000.

The breakwater, whose construction was recommended to the Minister by J. Watson MacNaught, minister for Prince, will run in an easterly direction from the end of the present West Point wharf. Its purpose is to give adequate protection for boats fishing out of West Point harbor.

### Sees Freeing Prisoners Wrecking Korean Truce

PANNUNJOM, (AP) — Peiping radio Friday night told Red China's troops in Korea that the UN command would imperil the truce by taking back 22,000 prisoners from an anti-Red camp Wednesday and would "wreck" it by setting them free a week from today.

The Chinese language broadcast to Communist soldiers was the first public reaction from inside the bamboo curtain to India's announced plan of returning disputed prisoners to the two commands Wednesday.
