Russia's Plan of Campaign.

ST PETERSBURG, Sept 5.—According to the provincial scheme, the administration of the Kwang-Tung territory will be entrusted to the chief who also commands the naval and military forces under the Minister of War. The seat of Government will be Port Arthur. The Exploitation of Port Dalni is assigned to the Eastern Railway Company. The judicial procedure will follow that introduced by Alexander II.
