Giants And Cards Provide Highlight Parmelee Winning From Hubbell In 17 Innings

(A.P. By Guardian's Special Wire) NEW YORK, April 29.—In one of the season's most pitching battles, Chicago Cubs behind Bill Lee defeated Van Lingle Mungo and Brooklyn Dodgers at Chicago today.

AMERICAN LEAGUE Rookie Defeats World Champions (A.P. By Guardian's Special Wire) NEW YORK, April 29.—Al Simmons banged a home run in the ninth inning at Washington today to spoil Pete Appleton's hopes of becoming the first pitcher to hurl a one hit game this season, but the 31 year old "rookie" nevertheless turned in his third victory for Washington, 7-3.

Washington scored four runs in the eighth on five hits. Hank Greenberg, the Tigers heavy hitting first baseman, was hurt in the sixth inning as he reached to the left for a wide throw and got in the way of Powell, who was racing toward first base. Powell barged into him, badly injuring the first baseman's left wrist.

NEW TROPHY FOR WINNER CANADIAN OPEN

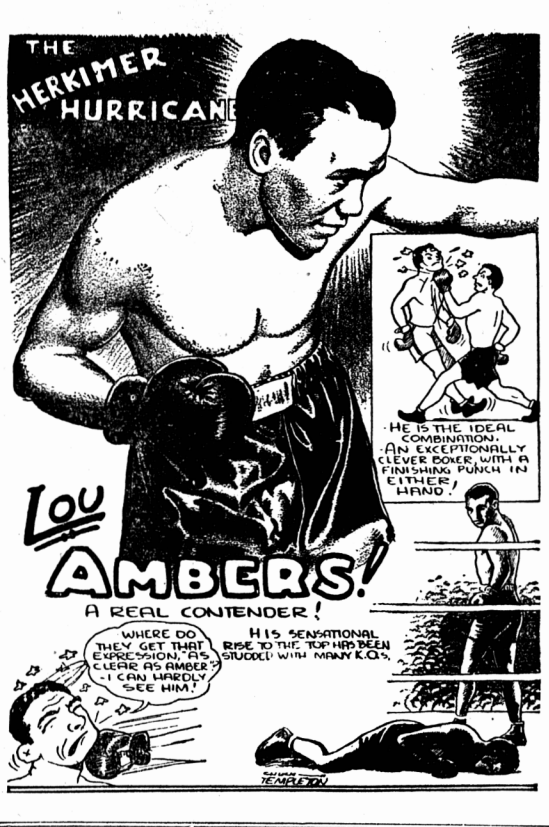

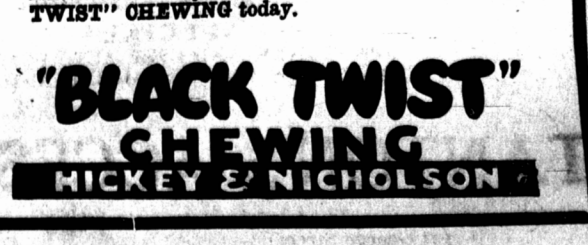
